Sermon Snippets

Colossians 3: 1-4

During this period of isolation it's very easy to get distracted and worried about the future. Of course there are issues to be concerned about and this is a call for us to pray.... but the Bible reminds us to set this in the context of our ultimate future: "set your hearts on things above" (Col 3 v2).

And one of the most important things is knowing how the results of the cross protect us from all accusation. *"Your life is now hidden in Christ"* (v3). The cross for the Christian isn't just the "means by which we enter into the Christian faith", it's also there to keep and guard us all the way to eternity!
