Mark 4: 35-41

We are all facing a perfect storm with hundreds dying most days, many job losses announced and real fears for the future.

Keith asks 'Who do we trust for the future?', and uses the Mark 4 story of the sinking fishing boat and Jesus stilling the water. He suggests that these men will never forget that Jesus has the power to guard them.

When God meets us in our storms and rescues us we will never forget that He has the power to guard us in our lives.

<u>Sunday</u>

On this Fathers' day we give thanks for our homes and family life, for those who raised us, for the male role models in our lives and for the opportunity of learning from them.

<u>Monday</u>

We pray today for our neighbours, for those living on our street, for those who pass by our homes, for those we see when out on exercise. We pray God's blessing on each of them.

<u>Tuesday</u>

We remember before God those who are not so well and those who mourn. Especially we remember those known to each of us personally, and the struggles they are facing at this time.

<u>Wednesday</u>

We pray with Christians Against Poverty, for God's continued blessing on the Weston Foodbank, and for those who receive the food parcels.

<u>Thursday</u>

We remember before God the work of medical missionaries abroad as they tend the sick, feed the hungry and show God's love in their surgeries and hospitals to those in need.

<u>Friday</u>

Take time today to bless the Lord, to praise him for his greatness, his majesty, and for the works of his hands; praise him for his creation, for food in due season, and for the daily goodness of the Lord that we receive at his hand (Psalm 104).

Saturday

We remember before God our clergy, lay readers and worship leaders, our Bishops, Archdeacons and Area Deans, that God's Word would come alive through them as they proclaim the Gospel of Christ tomorrow.


Barry, who organises the annual Open Gardens programme, writes:
