# **Services in September**

We've been thinking and praying together about how to reopen our churches for worship. Of course, we want to get back to church where the majority are able to attend, but this is still some way off. To my mind, the danger in simply restarting our two morning services at 10:30 am is that a) many folk who cannot yet attend church will feel very left out, and b) those who do attend may well be disappointed with the service under current guidelines. The PCCs have therefore agreed that for a "transitional period" we will have a different form of services starting in September:

- We keep the existing online service going and that it represents our main service. This will ensure the significant number who do not feel able to attend at the moment can feel part of what we're doing. When we're watching it, we can sing along and drink coffee which we can't do at church!
- We start a subsidiary reflective service of about 30 minutes at 9:45am at both churches. The idea is that those who attend that service can then return home, make a coffee and watch the online service with everybody else. The 9.45 service would not attempt to "become the main morning service". There will be a short meditation because the main teaching would be for the online service. My hope is that by offering something better suited to our restrictions, i.e. a reflective prayerful service, the sense will be that we are doing something new rather than try to reproduce the previous morning service.
