The Church of England have published guidance on Mental Health and Wellbeing during this very difficult time. The document states: "Often we think that our faith should get us through alone. But the reality is, we are all human and subject to both physical and mental ill health."

The guidance includes suggestions based on those published by the Mental Health Foundation on how to best look after ourselves as well as each other. They include:

- Try to avoid speculation; look up reliable information
- Follow the Government advice on staying safe
- Stay connected with other people
- Try to anticipate distress
- Look after your own spiritual health

Sermon Snippets

1 Peter 2 v 11-17

Peter our letter writer calls the Christians 'exiles' or 'foreigners'. He means that they are different because they have asked Jesus to be in charge of their lives. They march to a different beat and the quality of their lives should stand out. We are similar - we march to a different beat to the world around us. Our world does not finish when we die; the friendship and partnership with Jesus that we enjoy here moves with us to our life beyond the grave.

Tuesday

While we mourn the high death toll, yet give thanks in your prayers for the lives of Christians lost to the disease and that they are now with the Lord in paradise.

Pray for children and teachers as the new school year begins, that they may be able to make up for lost time and achieve success in the year ahead.

<u>Thursday</u>

Pray for a just society, and that movements such as 'Black Lives Matter' will help achieve equal opportunity and treatment for ethnic minorities around the world.

<u>Friday</u>

Give thanks that our online services have been shared by a wider audience and God's word has been taken beyond our own congregations.

<u>Saturday</u>

Praise the Lord for, throughout all the trauma of this year, he has been working his purpose out, and we can put our trust in him.
