Sermon Snippets

Isaiah 61: 1-4

This week we're looking at one of the prophecies in Isaiah about a Messiah to come. Jesus actually claimed this very prophecy for himself in Luke's gospel (chapter 4). The interesting thing for me has been reflecting on who this Messiah came for. It wasn't the privileged, rich or famous but quite the opposite - the "poor, the broken hearted and the prisoners". Those are the ones he came to help; to "bandage them up", to help and heal them. As followers of this Messiah we have the same role – to be "living God's love" to those who need it. but also to reflect on those areas of our own lives where we need help and so to be "living God's love" by rediscovering the Messiah's help and guidance for us too.

Prayer Pointers

Monday

As we get ready for Christmas, give thanks to the Lord that he so loved the world that He sent His son to Earth to save us from our sins.

Tuesday

Pray for the police and local authorities as they face the difficult task of enforcing responsible behaviour from the public over the festive period. Pray that the Christmas celebrations will not lead to a big increase in infections.

Wednesday

With the election in the USA finally resolved, pray for reconciliation there, and that the USA will once again become a force for Christian virtues in the world.

Thursday

Pray for those who in these dark winter days are far from home, friendless or lonely; particularly pray for those still having to shield from the pandemic. Pray also for those who have been bereaved this year and are facing a first Christmas without someone they love.

<u>Friday</u>

At this time of 'peace and good will to all', let us pray for less violence in the world in the year ahead. In the words of the carol, 'It Came Upon a Midnight Clear', we pray: "Oh hush the noise ye men of strife and hear the angels sing".

<u>Saturday</u>

As we come together over Christmas, let us give thanks to the Lord for our homes and the love of our families, and pray that when two or three are gathered in His name, He will be among us.
