Sermon Snippets

Family Likeness

Genesis 1: 26-31a

Has anyone ever told you that you're the image of someone in your family? If so, they've seen a family likeness in you.

In the account of God's amazing creation, we read that the final creation was us! Human beings, 'created in his image'. But what does that mean?

God not only gives us life but he also gives us some of his characteristics so that we are like him; we share a 'family likeness'.

We are not made to be 'look-alikes' but 'bealikes'.


But, how can we know what God's characteristics are? How can we reflect God's image and how can we see God's image in everyone even when sin blurs that image?

God's answer is Jesus. Look to him, how he lived and how he treated people for the perfect example of a life lived in the image of God.



Towards the end of last year so many people gave very generously towards the Operation Christmas Child Shoebox Appeal. People packed boxes individually, or gave items to be packed into shoeboxes, or donated online. Such was the generosity of folk in our two churches plus St Nicholas, Uphill, we sent about 120 boxes to bless children who would otherwise not have received anything. It was an expression of living God's love.

But where did the shoeboxes go? We now know that all of them travelled 1,680 miles to Moldova, part of a total of 37,552 boxes which were received by children there.

Bible Notes



Coffee after the Service...



"Let the words of my mouth and the meditation of my heart be acceptable in Your sight, O Lord, my strength and my Redeemer."

The scroll of the Torah* was open in front of him. These were his scriptures, all that he had. As he begins to read 'In the beginning God created the heaven and the earth', and as the story of Adam and Eve unfolds, he finds sin has entered the world and a plan of God's redemption for the world is starting to appear. As David meditates on those words, he finds them pure, clean and sure, and they converted his soul, rejoiced his heart and enlightened his eyes (vv 7 & 8).

The perfect and true words of God his heavenly Father convicted him of sin. He knew in his heart that he had sinned before God. Yet upon confession of his sin, it pleased God to grant David forgiveness, cleansing and a chance to begin again.

But David knew that his life had to change. His soul had been converted and his heart rejoiced but he had to think and act differently to that which he had in the past, and so he prays to the God of heaven from here on in to 'let the words of my mouth and the meditation of my heart be acceptable in your sight, O Lord my strength and my Redeemer'. All that he would say, all that he would think and meditate on in his heart was to be acceptable to his God.

These words are a challenge to us today just as much as they were for David. Having been convicted of sin and sought the forgiveness of God, let us pray these words through again, and like David asking that all the words of our mouths and that which we meditate in our hearts might be acceptable to our God who is our strength and our Redeemer.

*Note: The Torah is 'The Law of the Lord' in Psalm 19: 7 and in the original is plural meaning 'laws', 'directions' or 'instructions'. We know the Torah as Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers and Deuteronomy.
