## **Sermon Snippets**

John 19: 25-27

There is a cloud hanging over this year's Mothering Sunday. The loss of so many throughout our land over the last 12 months - Mothers and Grandmothers, as well as other family members, have left us.

John 19, our passage today, takes us to the small group of four distressed women and one disciple, John, standing at the foot of the cross. As Jesus hung dying he addresses his mother and in a sense all four of these women: Mary his mother, Salome his aunt, Mary, the friend of his mother and Mary Magdalene, a single woman whom Jesus had restored to dignity and health. We see all four as having mothering roles in life and sense Jesus' care for all of them. We think of all the differing mothering roles in our family lives and value each of them.

This group of women moved from here to prepare his body for burial only to find his body not there. The angels whisper that 'He is Risen' and in time they see the enormity of this, changing everything. As they stood at the tomb, Jesus was being welcomed into heaven before returning to earth for a short time to appear to the disciples. In time he will take his place ready to welcome them when their time comes.

If we have put our trust in Christ He will one day welcome us. As we look beyond the sadness at the ending of this life we can see the joy and expectation of a vision of a place, promised to be in heaven, with the Risen Jesus.

We wish all the ladies great joy on this Mothering Sunday.

## Lent Reflection

Before The Psalmist looks at some people in four differing and stressful situations he looks at the bigger picture. He states the fact that "*The Lord is good*". If you have a mirror in your room, please look into it and realise that the person you see is loved by God, whatever the circumstances of your life. That love is not dependent on deeds or thoughts. His steadfast love endures forever.



The Psalmist encourages us to cry to the Lord and he delivers us from our distress. Looking back over sixty years following Jesus I am amazed at how many times he has answered my weak prayers in ways that I could never conceive. He has delivered me from my 'distress'.

I was appointed to a post in the Midlands on a challenging estate filled with young people but with a church that had 16 elderly folks meeting in a rundown building. A thriving local church on the other side of town had been sending groups to work in the area for some years but had recently ceased. I prayed for helpers and knew the right answer so I told God to encourage the other church to help and went to ask. They had ceased because they needed everyone on their own patch and I was refused. As the Psalmist says, *"I cried to the Lord in my trouble"*. In my desperate prayers I had to learn the lesson that I could not tell God the who and how, but only throw myself on his merciful love and share my need and then ... listen. As I prayed God spoke to me firstly about his love for me, the other church and the thousands living around me. As I listened he gently adjusted my perception of the need.

A couple appeared on the scene who had been members in the past but had left in despair. They were very kind but quite troubled. After a while they offered to help with the tiny Sunday School. "Lord, I need someone to work with older young people." I had started a youth group of a handful of youngsters who had family links with church members but I was trying to do most things in church and not giving them enough attention.

A young man from another church knocked on my door and asked whether I needed help with the services. "No, Lord. I need help with the young people." He proved to be a very able speaker but because of work was only available on occasional Sunday mornings. The church grew and an unusual man joined who then came on a church holiday. He came to faith during the week and on returning home asked whether he could take over the youth group. "Lord, I have asked for a youth worker with skills, this guy is too old and unusual."

He proved to be a very unusual youth leader but the youngsters loved him and his methods and the group grew and matured almost alongside him. I had prayed for a skilled youth worker and God had provided a couple that transformed the top years of the Sunday School, Colin who had encourage me as we shared the planning and preaching, and then Gerry who was born and lived on the Estate and ran

a youth group that matched the youngsters needs. God knew the needs and had just the right people to fill his places in his Kingdom's work. I had cried over two years to the Lord in my trouble, and God answered me in His way and with people I would not have asked for.

The Psalmist's first verse is right "O give thanks to the Lord for he is good, for his steadfast love endures for ever"... and understands the future in a manner we can never foresee.

## World Day of Prayer

Last Friday morning 100 people gathered on Zoom to celebrate the World Day of Prayer in the Weston area. It was great fun to scroll through the four pages to spot familiar faces from Emmanuel and Christ Church.

The women of Vanuatu put together this year's service. Through the voices of local ladies (all wearing garlands of flowers), we heard about the lives of these women and their homes.

Vanuatu is a volcanic island group a little North-East of Australia and New Zealand. They produce tropical fruit in the lush conditions but mainly depend on tourism. Cyclones, earthquakes and eruptions can make life precarious for the mostly rural population. Education is only compulsory up to year 6 and many girls don't even get that far. Nevertheless, we heard stories of ingenuity and determination, and of faith in our loving Father God, overcoming difficult circumstances.

We were able to join in a meditation on the parable of the wise man who built his house on a rock, which survived the storms. We were encouraged to hold a stone and use it to focus our prayers. Some of these stones are going to be passed from one church to another as a physical reminder of a virtual event. It was a joy to celebrate with our united Christian family, gathered from different denominations – praying and worshipping together.
