Sermon Snippets



Genesis 3: 1-19

On Sunday we're thinking about what happened in the Garden of Eden where God warned Adam and Eve not to eat the fruit from just one tree.

The reality was that eating that fruit would make the eater "like God in knowing good and evil" and that knowledge of evil was something that Adam and Eve wouldn't be able to handle. The trouble was the fruit, like the fruit in this picture, looked delicious and juicy – and also the possibility to be "like God" seemed too good to miss.

Sadly, both Adam and Eve fell for the temptation to their cost. . . . and equally sadly, you and I have fallen for similar temptations to put our own wishes in front of God's for our lives. That's what the Bible calls "sin".

God didn't prohibit Adam and Eve because he was being nasty – but as a loving warning. How readily do you and I look to God for his will and how easily do we replace that with our own wishes which, often as not, get us into some trouble?

Coffee after the Service...

Faith in the Workplace - Paul Sodzi

This is a new mini-series which looks at the role that faith plays in the everyday lives of working people. My sincere thanks go to Pat for her invaluable help in putting this series together.



You have your own business; how many do you employ?

I started my own business in 2002, taking on employees in 2010. There are now 6 of us including myself.

I take it your staff are aware that you are a Christian; does that cause any difficulties from their point of view?

I'm not aware of any difficulties; 2 of them are Hindus and 2 are Chinese with possibly Buddhist or Confucian backgrounds. They accept my beliefs.

In the light of the fact that you are a Christian, how do they perceive the way you treat them?

I like to think that they can see the practical application of my faith in how I care for them and their personal needs. I try to go the extra mile beyond what they might expect of a boss, focussing on their welfare.

During Lent I always do something and they know why I do it; eg: giving up alcohol or chocolate. I don't aggressively try to share the gospel with them, but use any opportunities which arise. For example, on Good Friday one of my staff didn't realise it was a bank holiday and went in and did a few hours' work. I explained to him what Good Friday was and how a 33-year-old man long ago died for our sins to put us right with God.

I seem to remember you saying some time ago that you prayed for your staff regularly?

Yes, I do. I believe very strongly that it is a good thing to have someone praying for us. It is something I have personally benefitted from many times and I may be the only person bringing my staff regularly before the Lord. I pray that they may have the opportunity to know Him personally.

As you try hard to be a good boss, does that mean that your staff stay with you?

4 of the 5 people I employ now have been with me since they left university. There was a time a while back when I had to shed some staff, and it caused real conflict inside me. I hung on to them longer than I should have, worried about the implications of them losing their jobs, but they did go on to find other positions.

Anything else to add?

Only that I look on them almost as my children, as they have been with me since leaving university, and I believe prayer is the important thing. I know I fail sometimes in my actions, but I present them to God regularly and trust that He will bring them alongside in His own time and in His own way.
