

Sermon Snippets

Nehemiah 3: 1-12

Nehemiah was a very practical guy living in exile in Babylon. When he heard about the ruined state of Jerusalem he was determined to go there and rebuild the city walls.



Before he started he prayed, which all practical people should do. He then made a plan and organised his workforce.

He used all sorts of people from all walks of life, not just specialists, and built them into a team. As they built the wall they were also building a sense of community. The City of David, God's city, was being rebuilt to the glory of God, and the nation was being rebuilt as the people of God.

Eco-tips

Last month, the UN issued its starkest warning yet on climate change, they described this as "a code red for humanity." They went on to say that we can avoid climate catastrophe by taking action now. To quote the report, very low levels of greenhouse gas emissions "would have rapid and sustained effects to limit human-caused climate change".

Switching to green energy remains one of the most impactful changes we can make, we can also do some small things like cutting waste: -

- Keep your fridge cool at 5C
- Extend the life of greens such as lettuce, by wrapping leafy greens in a paper towel
- Store leftover food in containers and keep in the fridge but never put hot food in the fridge cool to room temperature first.
