Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding.

Proverbs 3: 5)

Sermon Snippets

Ezra 1: 1-5

We've been looking over the last couple of weeks at Nehemiah – how he returned to Judah and oversaw the building of Jerusalem's walls. We've been told that years before, Jerusalem had been destroyed, and thousands of people were taken captive from Judah to Babylon. So, what led to them being able to return?

There are two answers to that question. The first we find in historical documents and artefacts, and centres around Cyrus the Great, ruler of Persia. When he conquered Babylon he put in place a policy which allowed captives (including the Jews) to return to their homeland and worship their gods.

The second we find in another historical document - the Bible - where God gives us his viewpoint of the same event. And it shows that behind the wars and politics, God was at work.

When we look at national and global politics and wars we need to remember that there are two perspectives. Political leaders and rulers are making decisions which they think are in their favour but we mustn't forget that God is there too. He can, and does, work through all sorts of situations on a national and global scale sometimes without people even realising. If I can trust God to work in big global political decisions, how much more should I be able to trust him in the places I find myself, and in the decisions that affect my life.



We have just had the 3rd week of The Beacon after having to close at the start of lockdown 18 months ago. It is one of Emmanuel's outreach projects which we started over 10 years ago. It is an off shoot of Somewhere To Go which didn't meet on a Tuesday, and has an overt Christian element. We cook a meal for the homeless and vulnerable and then, for anyone who would like to stay we put 3 tables together and sit round with tea and cake and talk about what Jesus can do in our lives.

We like to have volunteers who are trying to move on in their lives and over the years quite a number have gone on the Alpha course at Christ Church and gone on to get baptised. They are a great testimony on how the Lord can turn our lives round and keep us on track. The volunteer helpers have a prayer time before we open the doors. We say a prayer of thanks before we serve the meal and occasionally someone asks if they can do it and it is humbling to listen to them. Jeff Morgan leads the discussion time. At the moment he brings an updated version of a parable which people can relate to. We end the discussion time by standing and holding hands in a circle and one of us rounds it off with a prayer.

We used to cook for 40. It has been a slow start but numbers are gradually increasing and it is lovely to see new and old faces. We had 8 stay for the discussion time this week which is about average but even when there is only one or two we often feel that they needed the time to themselves. 2 people who go to STG come early and put the tables and chairs out for us. They couldn't wait to get started which spurred us on! *Mea & Daphne*

Pray for our government, national and local, to have wise and compassionate hearts as they make policies and decisions on our behalf.


