(Luke 3: 2-6)



Theme: Blessed be the Lord our God ... who guides our feet into the ways of peace. **Response:** Lord, come to all we pray for; may you forgive and guide us all.

<u>Monday:</u>

Liberating God, inspire your Church. Pray for Ladies Together and for all who tell of the Lord's love. Ask for forgiveness when the Church misuses resources and fails to live up to Jesus' teachings.

Tuesday:

God of justice. Pray for Parish Prayers, The Beacon and New Dawn Counselling Service. Ask for God's compassion and mercy on all who are hungry, excluded on the margins of society, or caught up in war and violence while suffering from the greed and insensitivity of others.

Wednesday:

Lord eternal, transform our local, national and global politics. Ask God to stir every nation to honour the dignity of all people. Pray for the mid-week Communion service, Seedlings Toddlers Group and JaM Club. Pray for those who do not look forward to Christmas, who may be homeless, lonely, poor or deeply in debt. Pray that your home and heart may be places of love – where all are welcome.

<u>Thursday:</u>

God of healing and hope. Pray for the Friendship Group and Craft & Chat Group. Pray for all known to you who are ill, suffering, distressed or overburdened at this busy time. Ask that they may know the Lord's presence and peace. Ask that all who walk in darkness may come to know the light and love of God. Pray for all who are in hospital or in care homes and those who care for them - paid or unpaid.

<u>Friday:</u>

Lord of life and love. Pray for Life Groups, Locking Deanery, Bath and Wells Diocese and Weston Churches Together. Ask that the Lord will sustain children who mourn for parents, parents who mourn for children, and all those whose hearts are grieving today.

<u>Saturday:</u>

Pray for our vicar Tom, our curate Larissa, and their families. Ask for God's inspiration and guidance on all who prepare Sunday Worship, Christingle and Deaf Church services including retired clergy, readers, musicians and prayer leaders plus those who clean, garden, repair, administer, cater and welcome.

Church of England Safeguarding Training

All volunteers who hold a church DBS certificate are required to do Safeguarding training every 3 years.

We were due to hold a training session in March 2020 but it was cancelled due to the Covid lockdown and it is unlikely that faceto-face trainings will recommence. Most of us are now in the position that we need to renew our training as it is out of date.

Therefore you will need to access the online training which you can do in the comfort of your own home. Please can you log on to the Safeguarding Training Portal: <u>https://safeguardingtraining.cofeportal.org/</u> Scroll down and click on "create an account" and follow the instructions. Please make a note of the user name and password you use for future use.

Please complete the Safeguarding Awareness (C0) course first. This takes about 45 minutes, then complete the Safeguarding Foundation (C1) which takes about 1 hour. You don't have to do them on the same day but please forward me the email you get sent after completing each course, and also the certificates (you can print them off and give them to me or email them to me to print off for our records).

You only have to do the Safeguarding Awareness course once, but the Safeguarding Foundation course will need to be renewed every 3 years if you are still volunteering.
