Sermon Snippets

John 12: 12-19



Jesus had escaped from the hostility of Jerusalem and was in the wilderness near where John the Baptist had started his ministry. Folks were coming to him and an urgent message came from Mary and Martha in Bethany that their brother Lazarus was ill and could he come. Jesus waited two days and then set off, after telling his disciples that the illness was not fatal. He arrived in Bethany to find Lazarus had been in the tomb for four days and the place was filled with mourners. Martha rushed to him, and later Mary, both feeling that he was too late. Jesus was not flustered but simply told them that Lazarus would rise again. They thought that Jesus was speaking about the last days of this world when we would all rise again but Jesus showed his power in the face of death by commanding Lazarus to leave the tomb. Little wonder that a few days later, on the Feast, a great crowd gathered around Jesus mounted on a donkey with the Disciples as they walked down the Mount of Olives making a path of palm branches and shouting "Hosanna, King of David". Many had witnessed the greatest healing miracle of all and they knew that He was a special one sent from God.

Palm Sunday – Hosanna, Lord save now, was all their cry that first Palm Sunday. Pray that the Church would tell out that same message of saving faith and point the way to the Saviour that many souls this Eastertide may enter the Kingdom of Heaven.

Monday – We pray for the doctors, nurses and staff working in the National Health Service, particularly those in our local hospitals and health centres.

Tuesday – We remember before God the people of Ukraine displaced by war and violence, particularly where food, water and medicines are scarce.

Wednesday – We pray for our Clergy, Readers, Lay Ministers and Worship Leaders in our churches and ask God's blessing on their ministries as, together, we seek to live out God's love.

Maundy Thursday – On the night Jesus had supper with his friends, he washed the disciples' feet. Pray that God would enable us to follow his example of love and service for others.

Good Friday – We come to Him who died that we might live. Praise Him who endured the cross for our salvation.

Saturday – As we see what it cost Jesus to bear our sin, and the depth of the love of God for us, we pray that we might offer to him all that we have and are.

Prayer Labyrinth

A labyrinth is not a maze to get lost in, it is a single wandering pathway. Labyrinths have been used for centuries as a way of encouraging Christian reflection, meditation, and prayer. We are constructing a simple indoor Labyrinth in Christ Church for Holy



Week where the various places to pause will help focus our minds on the 'l am...' sayings of Jesus that we have been hearing about over the past weeks.



Each 'station' will have an explanation and some suggestions for prayers some involving simple acts to help us focus. You go round the labyrinth for self-directed private prayer and the average time it takes should be about 40 minutes but there will be various places where you can quit the labyrinth if you need to. There will be some simple resources for children as well if families would like to give it a go.

We shall launch the Labyrinth on **Sunday 10th April** at 5.00pm where we invite people to gather for an explanation of the journey. Refreshments will be served then until 6.30pm to allow us to let people round in small numbers to prevent congestion.

It will then be open during the next few days from **Monday II**th until **Wednesday I3**th at both 9.30am to 12 noon and 6.00pm until 8.00pm each day.
