Verse For The Week

"Early on the first day of the week, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene went to the tomb and saw that the stone had been removed from the entrance."

John 20: 1

Since Palm Sunday, the church worldwide has concentrated its teaching on the last few days of Jesus' life and the events that followed.

During this "holy week", on the Tuesday, clergy from across the diocese were invited to a service at our Cathedral in Wells. Ian Girling, Julie & John Birkett, and Larissa (who ably assisted in the service itself) joined me and were led by Bishop Ruth. Part of its purpose was to affirm and encourage us in each of our ministries.



Over the past eighteen months, while the diocese was "one Bishop down", three retired Bishops joined the service as they had been helping Bishop Ruth with her considerable workload – they were given a round of applause. It was a wonderful example of these three that, even though their diocesan job was completed, they were still willing to serve.

This service has been part of the regular calendar but, for the last two years, we had not met together and there was something very special in actually being together after such a long period of relative isolation. Zoom meetings can have their uses but, as we all know, they are no substitute for actually being with people!

As we shared Holy Communion together I thought about how the Easter Sunday message is so crucial. Yes, we share together in memory for what Christ did for us but we're not simply recognising a historical event alone. For all that Jesus did in His death on the cross was vindicated in that three days later He was to rise again. So we remember Good Friday but we do so in the very presence of that God who gave His life for us and is alive today and continuing to be with us in the power of His Spirit. If meeting together in the Cathedral was encouraging because we were with one another again; the greatest thing of all is that we can know God's presence together with us as He is alive and well.

At Christ Church we'll reflect together on what Jesus meant when He said "unless a seed dies it remains only a single seed. But if it dies, it produces many seeds" (John 12:24). Jesus was prepared to serve us in the ultimate way, by dying in our place. But rather than His death being a defeat, it had a purpose as He was brought back to life and, through the life of His Holy Spirit, is able to bring life to many. Ours is a living faith literally! Although I was reminded of that in the Cathedral, He is there for every single one of us to discover every day no matter where we are. I pray that each of us will explore what it means to encounter and follow a God who is alive and that you will be encouraged by his presence no matter what you're facing.

Prayer Pointers

Easter Sunday – Lord Jesus Christ, we praise you for the message of Easter, the assurance that life is not in vain, and that death is not the end but a new beginning. Receive the worship we offer you this day and teach us to live each day in the light of your Easter triumph. Risen Lord, lead us from death to life.

Monday – Lord Jesus Christ, we are not worthy to bear your name, for we fail you so often in so many ways. We come now committing ourselves afresh to your service, to stay true to you as you stay true to us. Time and again you welcome us back. Teach us to walk in faith.

Tuesday –We thank you for our two churches, Emmanuel and Christ Church, the fellowship that we share, and the opportunities that it brings. Please bless Tom and our church leaders with Your wisdom as they seek to guide us on our faith journey.

Wednesday – Lord, we pray that you will encourage and support all those suffering with Covid 19 and their families. May they know your peace and constant presence. We pray for others we know who are struggling with illness, grief, or depression.

Thursday – We pray for those places where tension and violence continues- thinking especially of Ukraine, where there is so much slaughter. We pray for all those caught up in the awfulness of war - those maimed and injured, those who have lost loved ones, those for whom life will never be the same again. May your spirit of love overcome all that causes people to take up arms against one another.

Friday – We pray for all those who have fled or are fleeing these situations and are now having to live in huge refugee camps with food shortages and no life outside their tents. We pray also for all the agencies seeking to help, that they will be provided with the necessary supplies.

Saturday – We pray for all Christians everywhere, especially in North Korea, and women in Afghanistan, Syria, and Nigeria who are persecuted because they bear your name. Encourage them and lift them up to know the wonder of your love for them.

O Jesus, Light of the World, be our guide through times of uncertainty ahead, with many changes in our lives including climate change. Teach us to walk by Your light no matter what dark days there may be coming.

A Thank You & Testimony from Penny

I'd like to thank my Christ Church family for all your prayers, cards, visits, and encouragement during these long months since I've had TN (trigeminal neuralgia) and been unable to be with you in church.

When it started again last May (I've had it on and off for many years) I fully expected the meds to work as normal and I'd soon be fine again. But it got worse. The meds weren't working. Weeks and months went by, medications were changed, there were visits to doctors and consultants, an MRI, and some different meds.

I had explained to God that I needed Him to heal me quickly as I was really rather busy. God listened and smiled! Time went by. I explained again, saying how busy I was and how only I could do all these important jobs. God listened and smiled! More time went by, more meds. Then (this was my best argument so far), I was becoming a burden to my family! God listened and smiled! Oddly enough, Barry and the children didn't seem to see me as a burden. Maybe I wasn't trying hard enough!

Despite the medication, the pain got so bad that I finally just had to let go, and then, when I stopped struggling, amazingly I began to discover more of how much God loved me and how close He was to me. Isn't that weird? Or maybe not? His agenda, His timing, His purposes, all so much better than anything I could have planned.



This time of awful pain, rather than being a time of fear and loneliness, became the most amazing time during which God spoke to me. He carried me through it. He taught me new things about Him, about myself, about my attitudes and behaviour, so much that I needed to learn.

Probably for the first time in 45 'busy' years as a Christian, God finally had my full attention. I began to learn a little of what Jesus meant when He said He would leave us the Holy Spirit, the Comforter. He has truly been my Comforter, when there was nothing and no-one else who could take away the pain. I saw Jesus smile at me. I found His presence in a way I had never known before. This time with TN has turned out to be one of the most precious times in my life. God is truly answering prayer.

My meds are starting to work now and I am looking forward to being back in church very soon. So, once again, thank you so much for praying for me and for encouraging me.
