An Anxious Time

There are times when bad things seem to be all around us and we can get anxious that they might happen to us. Then what? There are times when the unexpected surprises us and we don't know what to make of the 'new normal'. Certainly we can understand how events in the world around us lately can raise anxiety levels. But there are also times when we are called to face a challenge whether at work, or in our personal lives, or in our relationships and we are anxious not to fail.

In our reading from John this morning, the friends of Jesus faced all three of those things - danger, surprises and a challenge. Yet they were also told by the risen Jesus of what might help them to meet each of those circumstances - advice we might find useful today.



Relating to your neighbourhood

Over the years I've wondered how I can relate to my neighbours in a way that 'Lives God's Love'. I'm definitely not the person who can go round knocking on doors saying 'do you know Jesus?'. There must be other ways I can live out my faith in my neighbourhood.

The first possibility was when I discovered the Neighbourhood Prayer Network. This organisation has a vision to see every street in the UK covered in prayer. Their strategy is to pray, care and share for our neighbours. If you sign up, your street goes on the NPN map, you get



I had been praying in this way for a few years and then Covid struck. I was inspired by the members of my Life Group who immediately started communicating on WhatsApp. I thought I could give that a go on my street. I spoke to one neighbour and within a few hours I had several people I didn't even know signed up! At the height of lockdown there were nearly thirty neighbours in our WhatsApp group. We saw each other as we came out to clap the NHS and chat about everything from lost cats to waste collection. Every now and then I let them know I am praying.

Recently I found a practical way to serve my neighbourhood too. I signed up with North Somerset Council to 'Adopt A Street'. This means I am now officially a litter picker! I was provided with a hi viz vest, gloves, bags and the rather groovy picker. If you happen to drive along

Locking Road by the horse field you might see me wrestling with it.

Try asking God how you might demonstrate the love of God in your neighbourhood - you never know what the answer might be.
