NEWS FROM STREET PASTORS



Caring, Listening, Helping

The Coronavirus restrictions have hit many areas of our lives and Weston Street Pastors are no different. We have not been able to patrol since March 2020. However, the good news is that we are now ready to return and will be patrolling the streets from 10:00pm til 04:00am as from this week - Saturday/Sunday 30th April/1st May.

We have recently been advised by the local police and Community Support Officers that Street Pastors are very much needed again in Weston as there is, and has been, a lot of antisocial behaviour over the last year. There are major concerns over rising drug and alcohol abuse, often amongst those who are 18 or under.

We are looking forward to helping the people of Weston again this weekend and are asking if you would pray for us this week as we return for the first time. This is vital for our safety and for God to intervene and provide at the right moment as he has done so many times. We need your prayers. They really do make a difference. Due to the pandemic we have lost a lot of our regular Street Pastors. Before Covid, we were patrolling the streets of Weston once a week. At the moment, we don't have enough on our team so we are only able to patrol twice a month.

If you are interested in helping others particularly the vulnerable, the homeless, those with mental health issues, and young people sampling club life for the first time, then we would love to hear from you. CHURCH OF ENGLAND SAFEGUARDING TRAINING

Safeguarding, of our children and young people and of vulnerable adults, is a responsibility that we all share - not just the vicar and other leaders.

All volunteers who work with children and young people and vulnerable adults need to have a current DBS Certificate and, along with PCC members, are required to keep their safeguarding training up to date, which means renewing the training every three years.

All the training courses are now online and easy to access in the comfort of your own home (or that of a relative or friend if you don't have internet access at home).

It's easy to log onto the Safeguarding Training Portal, scroll down and click on "create an account" and follow the instructions - please make a note of the user name and password you use for future use (click link below): Please complete the Safeguarding Awareness (CO) course first (this takes about 45 minutes), then complete the Safeguarding Foundation (C1) which takes about an hour.

PCC members are also required to complete the Domestic Abuse Awareness course. You don't have to do them on the same day but please forward me the email you get sent after completing each course, and also the Certificates (you can print them off and give to me or email them to me to print off for our records).

You only have to do the Safeguarding Awareness course once, but the Safeguarding Foundation course will need to be renewed every three years if you are still volunteering.
