Sermon Snippets

John 15: 1-17



Have you ever seen a vine at harvest time? It may have been either on holiday or maybe you've seen pictures on the TV... and you'll have seen the vine laden with rich, juicy bunches of grapes.

In our reading on Sunday, we'll see that Jesus is using this as a picture of what our lives can become – fruitful. A fruitful life would be one of joy and care and compassion known within and also shown to others. It is a wonderful picture; "but" we may wonder "how is this possible"? The secret we'll discover is not in ourselves but is in something Jesus himself can bring us.

Prayer Pointers

Be encouraged this week to pray and ask God how you can spread the Good News.

Church Family:

"Lord, the one you love is sick." (John 11:3 NIV) We lift up to You, Lord, our loved ones and those in our church family who are sick, suffering, lonely, frightened, hurting, or bereaved. We pray that they may know God's presence amidst their pain. You are an amazing God and we thank You for all You do for us. We pray for those in our church family who are waiting for medical treatment of some kind and pray that You, Lord, will help find a way when there seems to be no way forward.

The Local Area:

As the pandemic situation changes, most of us have recently had a taste of feeling "harassed" by circumstances, helpless to change them and to make life work as we'd like it to. Pray that as post-crisis life goes back to normal for most people, that they would not revert to feeling self-sufficient but would have their eyes opened to their spiritual need.

National Prayer:

We live in troubled days. Pray for those who are struggling with unmanageable debts and the consequences to daily life that arise from this. And for those where their own families offer no support. Pray for the Christians Against Poverty charity (CAP) and the Foodbanks - that people will approach these charities, should they need help, without feeling too ashamed of their situation. Pray for all those involved in CAP and the Foodbanks and let us praise God for the many volunteers dedicated to helping the vulnerable.

Global Prayer:

Let us pray about the situation between Russia and the Ukraine - the impact this is having around the world, for the displaced, all those whose lives have been turned upside down, all who work around the borders of Ukraine, all who have been trying to keep safe in the underground bunkers, and all who have been caught up in this evil war.

Reflections on Spring Harvest

It was apt that the theme was Renew, Restore, Rebuild.

As it was the first Spring Harvest in person since lockdown, it was natural that much emphasis was laid on new beginnings. The Bible study on Nehemiah threw down a challenge to us:

To renew our strength and our hope in God;

To restore us to a new relationship with God - re-aligning ourselves with His vision for our church, our community, and the wider world; To rebuild but not to be satisfied to go back to how it was.



We heard about the persecuted church in Iraq, how they were instructed by the Bishop to rebuild, not as before but to be Centres of Hope.

Zechariah 2: 3-4 says:

"While the angel who was speaking to me was leaving, another angel came to meet him and said to him: 'Run, tell that young man, "Jerusalem will be a city without walls because of the great number of people and animals in it. And I myself will be a wall of fire around it," declares the Lord, "and I will be its glory within.""

The challenge thrown down is to rebuild forwards, not backwards. A church that is utterly dependent on Jesus. A church that is more for those outside than inside.
