Sermon Snippets

Mark 9: 30-37

"I declare before you all, that my whole life, whether it be long or short, shall be devoted to your service . . ."



This is a picture probably most of us recognise; that of our Queen's Coronation in 1953. But the Queen actually "became Queen" on the news of her fathers death in 1952 and the words above were made at that point.

It was an awesome responsibility for a woman still in her twenties. And yet, as we look back over the 70 years of her reign, that is exactly what she has done. She has served men, women, boys and girls in our country and the whole Commonwealth by being interested in them and serving us all in so many ways.

She has overseen her Government and many, many individuals and charities in their work. She has done it with dignity and enthusiasm, day in and day out, over these years.

When she made that commitment she finished with the words "God help me to make good my vow . . ." and that has been the secret of her life of service. She has looked to God for guidance and strength in the ups and downs of the nation's and her own family life. And He has given it to her. Although "Queen" is a position of great honour, her life has not been one of drawing attention to herself but rather it has been one of service — serving following the example of Christ.

We may not be royalty – but, as Christians, we are also called to serve those around us – what might that look like in your and my life?

NEW BISHOP OF BATH AND WELLS ANNOUNCED!

Downing Street have announced that the next Bishop of Bath and Wells is to be The Right Revd Michael Beasley, currently Bishop of Hertford in the Diocese of St Albans.

Bishop Michael comes to Bath and Wells with a passion for all aspects of mission found within the diocese, and was chosen for his gifts to lead us forward. He is very much a Bath-and-Wells-shaped-bishop, excited about rural ministry, pioneering, supporting communities and working with children and young people!

Bishop Michael grew up in rural Staffordshire attending a small Church of England primary school and a country church. He studied biology and epidemiology at Imperial College, London and Oxford University. He completed his ministerial training at Cranmer Hall, Durham. He was ordained in 1999, serving his title as a self-supporting minister in Lichfield Diocese, combining his scientific work with his ordained ministry.





As a scientist he worked extensively in the area of infectious diseases in children, that are prevalent in low-income countries.

Later he became a diocesan missioner and theological educator. In 2010, he was appointed Director of Mission in the Diocese of Oxford. In 2015 he was appointed Bishop of Hertford.

In the last few years he has been called back to epidemiology, initially supporting faith groups in the Democratic Republic of Congo during the Ebola outbreak. More recently he has supported the UK government, the NHS, and the Anglican Communion during the Covid-19 pandemic and faith leaders in their launch of vaccinaid.org.

Bishop Michael is married to Lizzie, originally from a farming family in Somerset. They have two children, Charlie (10) and Connie (8).

He says that he loves being a Bishop! Most important, is the privilege of being alongside the people and parishes he serves. The stand-out line from his consecration is 'bishops know their people and their people know them'. On arrival, his priorities will be "to be present for people, communities and churches as we re-emerge from the restrictions of the COVID pandemic and re-connect with each other after a time of separation and shock." Therefore, he will encourage churches to speak afresh Jesus' message of Good News and peace in the present context of international tension and local concern about the cost of living crisis.
