Sermon Snippets

Mark 10: 35-45

You'll have heard that some of us are doing the "Pastoral Principles" course looking at how, as Christians, we are to approach areas where we may disagree. One of the aspects of this is to be aware of "who holds the power" through their role, education, character, or any other consideration. The danger is that we may listen to those holding power more than others. Although our society often operates in this way, Christ calls us to a different way of working - that of being a servant. A servant (by definition) is there to attend to the needs of others and not just put forward their point of view.

As we see in our reading this week, the disciples struggled with this idea as they were much more concerned about building their own reputation. It's not an easy call for any of us - being a servant can mean so many things - but one of those is that we listen well to all and not just the "powerful people".



Celebration of Lay Ministries

On 2nd July the Diocese held a Celebration of Lay Ministries at Wells Cathedral. It was a wonderfully joyful service, giving thanks for the gifts used by many people across the Diocese of Bath & Wells.

We heard from various people about diocesan courses or ministries they're involved in such as the Exploring Spirituality course, Street Pastors, and music ministry. I had an opportunity in the service to tell people about the new diocesan course, Exploring Faith, which I've been teaching since January, and several people expressed an interest in joining the next module in the Autumn.

One of the most moving parts of the service was when Weston-super-Mare Dance Worship Group performed a beautiful dance accompanied by Locking Castle Youth Band singing, 'So will I'. We also had a time of creative expression where each member of the congregation was asked to make something out of craft materials to lay down in a meadow of hope. The service ended with people being invited to stand to celebrate the gifts they use to serve others. Lay Pastoral Assistants, Lay Worship Assistants, students who have completed any of the Exploring courses, tutors of these courses, churchwardens, treasurers, secretaries, administrators, parish magazine editors, PCC members, Deanery Synod members, parish safeguarding officers, and everyone else who offered their time and skills in the service of God and their community all stood as we gave thanks to God for the gifts that each bring.

This is an annual event and, if you serve God in the church and community as a volunteer, do try and get along to it next summer. It will be a real encouragement to you. Angeline


