## Finance Appeals

Many of you will have known of the financial appeals we have had at both churches - the provisional results are very encouraging.

At Christ Church we've needed to increase our regular giving as costs have increased over these last few years. We've received an increase of some £7,300 for this year (most of which is an increase in regular giving which will help us in future years).

Also, at Emmanuel, we've had an appeal for the restoration of some of the stained glass windows and one-off contributions have amounted to some £10,000. Praise God!

I want to thank you for your prayers and any contributions you have been able to make – particularly as this is not an easy time economically for many of us. These responses will help us - not just now but on into the future for the life and witness of our two churches.

## **Sermon Snippets**

Christ Church Jeremiah 29: 1-14

"If only...". How many times do you say these words? Indeed, how many times have you said them in the last couple of weeks? The truth is we often think this. More than once I've thought "if only I had some musical skills..." but, in truth, I lack what it takes and rejoice in those who are far better at this than me.



The Israelites must have thought it in exile. "If only we were in a better place then we could do so much more..." But God speaks to them, even when they feel they have ended up in the wrong place.

# **Prayer Pointers**

This week our prayers are again going to be centred around education as well as the upcoming Coronation.

Monday: We pray for Julie in her position as Chaplain at the College as she visits the different campuses, and for the staff working in the Welfare Department.

Students are under such pressure these days, often at home as well as at college. We pray, Heavenly Father, that the staff have the time to properly listen to the students, and we ask you to gift them with the right responses.

Tuesday: We pray for students facing exams or completion of courses, especially those under particular stress or coping with bereavement.

Wednesday: We pray for staff and pupils in our comprehensive schools who are having to cope with the same sort of stresses and pressures as college students. This can make it challenging for staff to create a good learning atmosphere.

Thursday: King Charles III and Queen Camilla are being crowned on Saturday. Today we pray for their families - that it can be a day of celebration and that at, whatever age, they have the energy to get through the day with a sense of peace and joy. We pray especially for Prince Harry and Meghan that they can put aside their differences and feel a part of the whole.

Friday: We bring the Archbishop of Canterbury before you Lord - that he is full of your grace in the central role that he has. Also our Bishop of Bath and Wells as he assists him and all the other clergy involved with the ceremony.

Saturday: Coronation Day. Holy Father, look down on today - may the sun shine and that all who have travelled to London to be a part of the event be full of joy and celebration. We pray that nothing happens to mar the day. Above all we pray for your new King and Queen, with all the new responsibilities placed upon them, that they will look to you for peace and guidance. We also pray for the police - that there will be no scares or disturbances and that they too can enjoy the day.

# A REMINDER... CHURCH OF ENGLAND SAFEGUARDING

Safeguarding, of our children and young people and of vulnerable adults, is a responsibility that we all share - not just the vicar and other leaders.

All volunteers who work with children and young people and vulnerable adults need to have a current DBS Certificate and, along with PCC members, are required to keep their safeguarding training up to date, which means renewing the training every three years.

All the training courses are now online and easy to access in the comfort of your own home (or that of a relative or friend if you don't have internet access at home).

It's easy to log onto the Safeguarding Training Portal, scroll down and click on "create an account" and follow the instructions - please make a note of the user name and password you use for future use (link:

#### https://safeguardingtraining.cofeportal.org/)

Please complete the Safeguarding Awareness (CO) course first (this takes about 45 minutes), then complete the Safeguarding Foundation (C1) which takes about an hour.

PCC members are also required to complete the Domestic Abuse Awareness course. You don't have to do them on the same day but please forward me the email you get sent after completing each course, and also the Certificates (you can print them off and give to me or email them to me to print off for our records).

You only have to do the Safeguarding Awareness course once, but the Safeguarding Foundation course will need to be renewed every three years if you are still volunteering.

The Church of England National Safeguarding Sunday was held last November but, as we had a busy autumn in the Christ Church calendar, it was decided to hold our Safeguarding Sunday service on 26th February this year. Larissa prepared a great service and tackled a potentially difficult subject in a sensitive way. We had some very appreciative comments after the service. If you missed it, you can watch it here:
