Eighth Sunday After Trinity

Sermon Snippets

Christ Church Matthew 9: 18-26

You are just on your way out when the phone rings, or you are hurrying down the street when someone you haven't seen for some time wants to tell you something, or you don't know what to say to someone who has a problem so should you avoid them. Difficult things come along just when we're at our busiest. How do we handle

those situations? How did Jesus manage on a day full of interruptions?

Matthew tells this well known incident in a slightly different way to

the dramatic story we usually read.



EMMANUEL LUKE 10: 25-37

'Oh no! Not the good Samaritan again' - that may well be your understandable reaction having heard many a sermon on the kind-hearted chap. However, as the old hymn puts it:

'Tell me the story often For I forget so soon; The early dew of morning Has passed away at noon'

And that applies to all parts of the gospel story.

Pray that the Holy Spirit may touch us with something significant for our spiritual



journey through song, prayer, Scripture, or message.

Prayer Pointers

We give thanks for the recent Weston Church Fest and pray for more opportunities to worship and serve our One God together. We pray for unity in the worldwide church, focussing on the things we have in common rather than our differences.

Tuesday: God's special possession, that you may declare the praises of him who called you

We give thanks for Tom, Larissa, and all who lead our two churches. We are grateful for everyone who plays a part in our services. We bring ourselves before God and ask how each of us can serve in the life of our church, and that each thought, word, and deed becomes an act of worship in our daily lives.

Wednesday: Out of darkness into his wonderful light

There are many areas of the world where there seems to be darkness. Take a moment to look at the news and pick just one or two places around the world where there are wars, natural disasters, or disorder and chaos. Let us ask God to bring his peace and light into dark situations. May we each continue to pray for these situations.

Thursday: Once you were not a people

Let us remember times in our past when we have either not known God or times when we have wandered from his path. Let us praise God for his redeeming love, his grace and mercy shown to us as he brought us back to himself, and also for the people who encourage us to live a life worthy of the calling we have received.

Friday: But now you are the people of God

We are his hands and feet, right where we live and work. Who can we pray for by name? To whom can we reach out with acts of service, words of encouragement, or quality time? Let us ask God – honestly – how we can be salt and light in the world around us. Lord, help us to be the people of God in the world, in our town, and in our friendships and families.
