### Luke 4: 14-30 & Isaiah 11: 1-10

This Sunday at Emmanuel we are marking Housing Justice Sunday.

This passage in Luke is sometimes known as the Nazareth Manifesto. In it, Jesus delivers his mission statement for ministry which is to put the poor front and centre of his work.

These two readings are all about relationship. Through good relationships with God and one another, the Holy Spirit transforms our lives to look more like Jesus'.

As church families, we are called to love one another and we are called to work for justice.

By listening to the stories of different people, we are all empowered and enriched. This is our commission and this will be at the heart of our service today.

## Housing Justice Sunday

This Sunday at Emmanuel we are holding a Housing Justice Service - as we think about the issues of homelessness faced by many in our community. This is particularly relevant to us as a town centre church where people regularly sleep and gather.

It is a challenge for us as a Christian community, as we seek to both show Christ's love and compassion whilst also dealing with the difficult and often unpleasant realities that come with people sleeping in the church grounds. We find ourselves being challenged to live as salt and light; not notionally, but in the practical day to day life and ministry of the church.

The truth is, it's often easier to pray it, sing it, and preach it than it is to live it out! And that's why we need God's daily equipping.
