## **Prayer Pointers**

Sunday: Let's be honest - how many of us in Christ Church and Emmanuel have the opportunity to spend any meaningful time in personal prayer or Bible reading? Perhaps only those who are retired or self employed.

"Drop Thy still dews of quietness, till all our strivings cease; take from our souls the strain and stress, and let our ordered lives confess the beauty of Thy peace".

Monday: Back to work or school - 'the daily round, the common task...' - hurry to catch the train, bus, whatever. Dear Lord, please be with me today. I've got such a lot to get through - quite apart from getting the children up, dressed, breakfasted, and off to school. Father, forgive me if I haven't much time except to say "hello" to you and "thanks for a good night's sleep".

Tuesday: Isn't the news depressing? All those forest fires, earthquakes, floods. Thousands - not hundreds - swept away. Scores of thousands bereaved. Father, comfort and heal all those who are in any way distressed in body, mind, or spirit - that they may be delivered out of all their afflictions.

Wednesday: Find out about the work of some aid agencies: Tearfund, Barnabas Fund, Christian Aid, Cafod, The Red Cross, London City Mission, and others. The Foodbank in this town and elsewhere. Pray for them - especially for people in Christ Church and Emmanuel who are involved with them.

Thursday: Jesus promised he would return and, in a number of his parables, he warned us to be ready but he didn't say when! A Christian man I once knew had a little card propped up on his mantlepiece. It bore just two words: "Perhaps today". Pray about your situation today.

Friday: What's the most hazadous thing you do? When you hear a plane flying high overhead, as we often do in Weston, send up a prayer for all the passengers and crew in it that they may arrive safely at their destination.

Saturday: Pray for those in our two churches who will carry the responsibility for the Sermon tomorrow. May their words, led by the Spirit, stir us to compassion, to action, and to a renewed faith in Jesus.

## Open Gardens Report 2023

The idea of inviting church members from Christ Church and Emmanuel to open their gardens to visitors for refreshments

was originally instigated to help pay for the newly erected Spire Centre.

It was intended that these should cease when the building had been paid for, around 2009.

However, they proved so popular that they have continued ever since!

In the early days, gardens were opened on various days of the week and they could be morning or afternoon events. More recently, they have fallen into a pattern of fortnightly Saturday afternoons between 2:30pm and 5pm (although 'closing time' tends to be a bit elastic, depending on the weather and the number of visitors!). Newcomers will find Open Gardens a great way of getting to know people from both churches.





The season began at the garden of Grace Monk on May 20th, on one of the hottest days of the year when some shade was very welcome! The next events were held in June with Terry & Margaret Baillie and then John & Kathy Hinchliffe.

In July we visited Martin & Nicky Boardman - this was a new venue and what a delightful garden it was!

Alan & Maureen Whitfield followed in August but had to hold the event indoors because of the rain. Also in August, Barry & Glenys Sutton-Jones offered their garden at the aptly named Southridge Heights which provided extensive, but sometimes draughty, views across the Severn Estuary and beyond.

The programme was rounded off in September by Tony Cornford and his neighbour, Sandy Beckford, who have removed the boundary between their properties to give a good-sized and attractive back garden. And, finally, Meg Hill invited us for a return visit to her garden. Unfortunately, this was also a rainy event which prevented us from going outside. Nevertheless, we were well looked after by Meg and her daughter, with the customary table of cakes and pastries.

The layout of the printed programme continues to be very attractive and for this we have to thank Emma in the Office and also Terry Baillie who puts together the animated screen displays at Christ Church. Thanks also to David White at Christ Church and Carl Evans at Emmanuel who record the donations given at the various events.

The future of Open Gardens depends entirely on those willing to host them. We have lost several venues in recent years and have yet to attract newcomers to come forward with what they can offer. Although intended primarily as social events, voluntary donations raised £445 from the three events held by Emmanuel and £530.70 for the remaining five hosted by Christ Church.
