Katie and Ian were invited to an Ambassador's Garden Party held to celebrate Harry and Meghan's wedding. Sadly no Ferrero Rocher and it was held indoors due to rain (see photo attached of Ian with Katie wearing her British hat).

One summer, when the top diplomats were serving in far-flung parts of Russia or on leave, Ian was the most senior person at the embassy for a week. As such, he represented the Ambassador at a meeting at a Russian government department and was driven there in the ambassadorial car, complete with the British flag flying on the bonnet.
