
Sermon Snippets

Christ Church
John 20: 30-31

"Life"

Life is what we experience when we're getting on with things - it's the comings and goings of what we do every day. So what does Jesus mean when he talks about having life? I mean, aren't we already living?

Come along / tune in on Sunday as we look at this - what does it mean to live in the strength of God's creative goodness?



Emmanuel John 10: 22-30

We have got used to the idea of 'fake news'
- things reported that are not real even if
doctored pictures appear to say otherwise.
However, some strange facts do prove true!

Social media, as well as some news outlets, report as 'news' some things that are just not true. Some are easy to disprove while others are harder and can cause real mischief.

The Jewish leaders, steeped in a tradition that read scripture only one way, were also sceptical about Jesus and his claims.

Was it an early example of 'fake news'? How does John record Jesus' response in this morning's reading? And how does that help us live amidst the maelstrom of communications that are

both true and false?
