Sermon Snippets

Christ Church Romans 12: 1-21

This is the last Sunday in our sermon series exploring being ROOTED and FRUITED in Christ.

Paul's writing in Romans about how we are to live as followers of Christ is both

countercultural and challenging. So how does knowing WHO we are, and WHOSE we are, equip us for HOW we are to live.

Let's think about this together on Sunday.



Emmanuel John 18: 33-37

Pilate asks Jesus, "Are you King of the Jews?". We afford Jesus many titles - Saviour, Master, Lord, Good Shepherd - many of these may reflect what we would like Him to be for us.

Today we celebrate Christ as King. What does that mean for us? How should we respond to being His subjects?

Prayer Pointers

Church Family:

We pray for the seeds sown so far in all those taking part in our Life Groups: "So that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith. And I pray that you, being rooted and established in love, may have power, together with all the Lord's holy people, to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ." (Ephesians 3: 17-18). Let us lift up to our Lord our loved ones and those in our Church family who are sick, suffering, lost, lonely, hurting, or bereaved. We pray that they may know God's presence amidst their pain.

Let us bring before the Lord those in both our Church families who are feeling stretched at this time, especially with Christmas preparations on the horizon. We pray that they can cope and that they remain hopeful that God will bring strength and peace.

The Local Area:

We live in troubled days. As Christmas time approaches, pray for those in our community who are struggling with debts and the consequences to daily life that arise from these, thinking especially of the Foodbank as they help increasing numbers of people in poverty.

As the colder weather approaches, let us bring before the Lord our street we live in, the local town and community, families on the edge, and especially the homeless.

Matthew 6: 32-34 - "Your heavenly Father already knows all your needs. Seek the Kingdom of God above all else, and live righteously, and he will give you everything you need."

National Prayer:

We pray for our children in society today - for their education, for the youngsters who are at crisis point and slipping through the cracks of education, and also for child food poverty. We lift up to our Lord all who are working supporting local schools, for school educators, and school staff. Pray that the children may grow into the fullness that God has in store for each of them.

We pray for our farmers at this time - of the extra tax implication that has hit them in the budget, how this may affect crops, the working conditions as they work in the changing seasons, and the effect this may have on the availability of local produce.

Please take time to reflect in your prayers and think how God may be prompting us to make a difference.

Global Prayer:

We pray for the people of Ukraine and ask the Lord to be close to them at this time - protecting them, helping them, and encouraging them to walk in His ways so that peace will become a reality in Ukraine and around the world.




