Christ Church Colossians 1: 21-23

But don't despair because the status and future for Christians is brighter than we might have imagined...



Charity Of The Month

We are launching a new initiative at Emmanuel this Sunday called 'Charity Of The Month', following on from the success of Lynda sharing with us about her involvement with The Ripple Effect last year.

Most of us in church will have particular charities or organisations that we are committed to supporting financially, through volunteering, advocacy, prayer, and many other ways.



As a way of getting to know what God has called each of us to be passionate about, there will be an opportunity each month (2nd Sunday in the month) for someone to share with us in church a little about a charity they support, why it is important to them and how we might also support them.

To launch the initiative, Daphne will be telling us about Open Doors this Sunday, whose work Daphne is a passionate advocate for. She will be specifically sharing about The Arise Africa petition. Millions of Christians face violent persecution for their faith in sub-Saharan Africa and the numbers are rising rapidly, with whole communities displaced and their land taken. And yet the world has barely noticed. In response, the African church is calling on us, their Christian brothers and sisters around the world, to join them in the Arise Africa campaign. It aims to see that the global community acknowledges and acts against extreme violence and supports the church to persevere – and to be resilient, resourceful, and influential. We can do this in several ways, which Daphne will share with us this Sunday, but the main focus is on a global petition aimed at local governments, the African Union, the EU, and the UN, asking for: Protection, Restoration, and Justice. There are copies of the petition in both churches or you can sign the online petition. You can read more here.



And please come to Emmanuel this Sunday 9th February to hear Daphne tell us more about this.
