#### <u>Weston Hospicecare (Part 1)</u>

A few weeks ago, Christ Church hosted Weston Hospicecare's Summer Remembrance Service. Families of Hospice patients who have died in the previous year are invited to attend.

As the name of their loved one is read out, they are invited to place a sunflower in a vase.



It is a beautiful, peaceful event which has become an annual event at Christ Church, renewing a link from the very beginning of Weston Hospice...

Many of you will be aware of Weston Hospicecare in Uphill through family members or friends who have received their care. You may not know that Christ Church played a large part in it coming into existence.

Our previous vicar, Geoff Hobden, and his wife, Hazel, along with Mary Armstrong, Maureen Whitfield, and others believed that there must be something better for those in need of end of life care.



In 1989, with support from local doctors and donations from individuals and community groups, the charity was officially launched. Within three years they had a property in Montpelier from which they ran a Day Hospice as well as some specialist community nurses.

They were able to move to their current home in Uphill following a generous legacy from Enid Sybil Jackson-Barstow. This facility now has a 10-Bed Inpatient Unit, a state-of-the-art Day Hospice, a Wellbeing Centre, a spa room, The Haven for quiet reflective time (with a stained glass window designed by Hazel Hobden), in-house catering, and beautiful gardens.

## Christ Church 1 Chronicles 17: 16-27

In this week's reading, we see how King David responds to God's faithful promise.

In one short chapter of 2 Samuel we find he becomes an adulterer and a murderer. It's a tough passage to face.

The danger is to think that, because we may not have committed a capital offence, this doesn't apply to us... but, in truth,



temptation and sin are a real part of all of our lives.
