## The Notable Club

This wonderful club has been in existence for 42 years and was set up when Community & District Transport had a mere two buses with tail-lifts (now they have over thirty!). The Club could not exist without this accessible transport as so many of our members need to be in wheelchairs, either manual or electric.


I had a long-time friend whose husband developed multiple sclerosis and was one of the founder members of the Club. So, when I retired 32 years ago, I went along as a volunteer.

The Notable Club was originally formed by just a few disabled friends realising that there was a need in the town for a friendship group for people who had physical disabilities. The Club brings varying physically disabled people together from all over our district every week. They make lifelong friendships which really enhances their lives. We have even had members who belong to the Club getting married to each other!

The Club is run by volunteers who seek to enhance the lives of Club members by giving them the opportunity to take part in activities that would be easily enabled by people without the different physical problems that our members have to cope with. Our programme includes things such as talks and entertainment at the Club Hall (which is the Scout

Hall in Windwhistle Lane), lunches, outings at least once a month, holiday breaks, and a Tinsel/Turkey Weekend near Christmas.

Membership has fallen since Covid but we would be pleased to welcome any physically disabled people who feel they would benefit from this weekly Club.

## **Prayer Pointers**

#### Monday

#### <u>Tuesday</u>

## Did you KNOW

Anyone who is on either Christ Church's or Emmanuel's Flectoral Roll, and living in the Diocese of Bath and Wells, is eligible to apply for a Wells Cathedral Parish Pass which provides free admission to the Cathedral for the duration of the current who can issue Electoral Roll period.
