Christmas Prayer Pointers

Prayers For Christmas Week

Give praise and thanks to our Eternal Lord Christ who, in great humility, was born of the Virgin Mary and became human for our salvation.

Pray that Christmas in your family will be a time of joy, harmony, and fellowship. But, as you join in the worship of the angels for the great joy of Christmas and for all the pleasures of the festive period, don't forget to bring before God in your prayers all for whom Christmas brings no happiness: the homeless who must spend the Christmas period on the cold streets; those with no family or who have recently been bereaved for whom this is a lonely time; and the sick, who must spend Christmas in hospital or undergoing treatment.

Prayers For New Year Week

As we arrive at the end of the year, give thanks for all God has done for you in the year now ending: for healing in times of illness; for protection in times of danger; for fellowship in times of need.

Ask for God's blessing on anyone known to you for whom this has been a sad year and pray that they will know his presence with them as they face the future.

In these unstable times, pray for the peace of the world in the year ahead and pray for leaders of the free world - that God will grant them wisdom and guidance.

Give thanks to God, who is the same last year, next year, and forever. And in whose hands our future is secure.

Prayers For Epiphany Week

The Feast of the Epiphany is when we recall the arrival of the wise men, guided by a star. Praise God for those who have been the 'star' in your life - those who first led you to Jesus and all those who have given guidance on your spiritual journey.

The gifts of the wise men, incense and myrrh, remind us of the culmination of our Saviour's earthly life. Give thanks to the Lord Jesus for his suffering for us and for death and resurrection. Gold is a precious gift that is bright and does not tarnish praise God for his precious gift of the Holy Spirit and pray that, in the year ahead, he will grant you a faith that is bright and never fades.
