READ TOGETHER

Acts 2: 1-13

International Children's Bible (ICB)

2 When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. ² Suddenly a noise came from heaven. It sounded like a strong wind blowing. This noise filled the whole house where they were sitting. ³ They saw something that looked like flames of fire. The flames were separated and stood over each person there. ⁴ They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and they began to speak different languages. The Holy Spirit was giving them the power to speak these languages.

⁵ There were some religious Jews staying in Jerusalem who were from every country in the world. ⁶ When they heard this noise, a crowd came together. They were all surprised, because each one heard them speaking in his own language. ⁷ They were completely amazed at this. They said, "Look! Aren't all these men that we hear speaking from Galilee? ⁸ But each of us hears them in his own language. How is this possible? We are from different places: ⁹ Parthia, Media, Elam, Mesopotamia, Judea, Cappadocia, Pontus, Asia, ¹⁰ Phrygia, Pamphylia, Egypt, the areas of Libya near Cyrene, Rome ¹¹ (both Jews and those who had become Jews), Crete and Arabia. But we hear these men telling in our own languages about the great things God has done!" ¹² They were all amazed and confused. They asked each other, "What does this mean?"

¹³ But others were making fun of them, saying, "They have had too much wine."



New International Version (NIV)

2 When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. ² Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting. ³ They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. ⁴ All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them.

⁵ Now there were staying in Jerusalem God-fearing Jews from every nation under heaven. ⁶ When they heard this sound, a crowd came together in bewilderment, because each one heard their own language being spoken. ⁷ Utterly amazed, they asked: "Aren't all these who are speaking Galileans? ⁸ Then how is it that each of us hears them in our native language? ⁹ Parthians, Medes and Elamites; residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, ¹⁰ Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya near Cyrene; visitors from Rome ¹¹ (both Jews and converts to Judaism); Cretans and Arabs—we hear them declaring the wonders of God in our own tongues!" ¹² Amazed and perplexed, they asked one another, "What does this mean?"

¹³ Some, however, made fun of them and said, "They have had too much wine."

Action Story

Lots of Jesus' friends were together. (interlock your fingers)

Suddenly they heard a noise like the wind filling the room. (blow into your cupped hands)

Then they saw flames dancing above everyone's head. (hold both hands up and wiggle your fingers)

God had sent his Holy Spirit to be with them always. (put both thumbs up)

Everyone rushed outside. (push your hands away)

They all began speaking in different languages, so everyone could understand them. (*make chattering hands*)

They told everyone about Jesus. (sweep both your arms out wide)



PLAY TOGETHER



Pentecost is the day the Church was born. Why not have a Pentecost Birthday Party for the Church with cake and balloons? (Any excuse for cake!)



You can make Pentecost Party Hats from the Make Together section.

As you celebrate, think of all the things you're thankful to God for about our church. Sit in a circle or, if there's only two of you, sit opposite each other. One person starts by saying, "I love Christ Church/Emmanuel because..." (fill in the blank) The next person says "I love Christ Church/Emmanuel because..." – they have to say what the first person said and then add their own thing they love about church. You can keep this going as long as people can think of things they love about our church, or as long as you can remember what other people have said!

MAKE TOGETHER

Pentecost Party Hats

If you have a paper plate you could make a hat like this one.







Cut the plate as shown and fold back the triangles to make a crown shape. Decorate your hat. You can use 'flame colours' such as red, orange and yellow. You can use paint, pens or stick on coloured paper.

If you don't have a paper plate (or your head is a bit bigger!) you can use a long strip of card. We used card from a cereal box and covered it in tin foil.









Again, you can use whatever you like to decorate your hat. Maybe you can make some painty flame hand prints or draw and colour some flames with felt tipped pens. Join the ends together to make a hat!





Wind Spinners

Indoor version -

Paint, colour and decorate a circle of card/thick paper/paper plate.

Draw a spiral on it and cut it out.

Make a hole in the end at the centre of the spiral and thread through some string, wool or ribbon so that you can hang it up.

Put it near a window so you can see it spin in the breeze.









Garden version (adult help required) -

Use permanent markers to decorate a clean plastic bottle.

Cut the bottle as shown to form a spiral.

Tie around the neck of the bottle with string or wool so that you can hang it up outside and watch it spin in the wind.

Before

Luke 9:18-20 - Peter's confession of Christ

Mark 8:31-33 - Jesus rebukes Peter

Mark 14:32-38 – Peter sleeps while Jesus prays in Gethsemane

John 13:36-38 - Jesus predicts Peter's denial

John 18:15-18, 25-27 - Peter denies Jesus

John 21:1-3, 15-17 – Peter goes fishing after Jesus' death and then is reinstated after his denials

Acts 2:14-15, 37-38 – Peter preaches and 3,000 people become Christians

Acts 3:1-10 – Peter heals the lame beggar

Acts 10:9-20, 23-26, 44-48 – Peter has a vision, goes to Cornelius' house and sees him receive the Holy Spirit

Acts 12:1-19 - Peter is in prison and is set free

1 Peter 1:1-2 – Peter writes his first letter

2 Peter 1:1-2 - and his second letter
