READ TOGETHER

Matthew 13: 1-9, 18-23

It sprang up quickly,



because the soil was shallow. ⁶ But when the sun came up, the plants were scorched, and they withered because they had no root. ⁷ Other seed fell among thorns, which grew up and choked the plants. ⁸ Still other seed fell on good soil, where it produced a crop—a hundred, sixty or thirty times what was sown. ⁹ Whoever has ears, let them hear."

¹⁸ "Listen then to what the parable of the sower means: ¹⁹ When anyone hears the message about the kingdom and does not understand it, the evil one comes and snatches away what was sown in their heart. This is the seed sown along the path. ²⁰ The seed falling on rocky ground refers to someone who

hears the word and at once receives it with joy. ²¹ But since they have no root, they last only a short time. When trouble or persecution comes because of the word, they quickly fall away. ²² The seed falling among the thorns refers to someone who hears the word, but the worries of this life and the deceitfulness of wealth choke the word, making it unfruitful. ²³ But the seed falling on good soil refers to someone who hears the word and understands it. This is the one who produces a crop, yielding a hundred, sixty or thirty times what was sown."

TALK TOGETHER



When we look at a plant, we only see a part of it. Deep under the soil are the roots, working hard to ensure the plant stays alive and continues to grow. They may not be pretty or even on view, but you would certainly notice if a plant had no roots!

In the Bible reading today we see that whenever the seeds failed to put down roots, or where the growth of those roots was limited; the plant failed to grow strong. The same is true for us. When we see other Christians growing well, we should be aware that it isn't what's above the surface that matters; it's how deep we're growing our roots.

- What do you think are the outward signs of a healthy, growing Christian?
- What does it mean to set down good roots?
- What should we do to best grow our relationship with Jesus?
- What obstacles may be getting our way?
- During this pandemic and time of lockdown, which soil does it feel like you've been in? Why?

PLAY TOGETHER

Get it in the good soil!



Make a target like the one in the picture – you can use card from your recycling box or tape some pieces of paper together to make it as big or as little as you like. Label each circle with words or pictures – the centre is **good soil** the next circles are the **weed**s then the **rocks and stones** and the then the **path and birds**.

Depending on the size of your target, find some 'seeds' to throw – You could use actual seeds (large ones like sunflower or pumpkin seeds or buttons or beads.

Take it in turns to throw your 'seeds' – seeds that fall in the good soil get one point each, take away a point for any that fall in the other circles - You might end up with a minus score!!

MAKE TOGETHER

Seed mosaics

Being careful of any allergies, why not make a seed mosaic. Draw an outline of a plant or flower or of your own name and fill it with different seeds.

Write the Bible Reading (Matthew 13: 1-9, 18-23) or the whole of verse 23 at the bottom as a reminder.







Story Chatterbox

You will need a square of paper and some pens or pencils.

- Fold the paper into quarters then unfold.
- Fold each corner in towards the middle.
- Turn the paper over so that the folded edges are face down, and now fold each corner in towards the middle again.



• Write numbers 1 to 8 on each of the folded triangles, then lift the flaps and write the story in eight parts underneath each triangle shape. (or draw it in pictures)



• Flip it over and decorate the folded squares with colours. Place index fingers and thumbs into the squares on each side to fold the story chatterbox in with the coloured squares on top.

How to play Choose a colour. Spell out the colour as you move the story chatterbox e.g. yellow = 6 moves.

- 1. Choose a number from one of the triangles and move the story chatterbox that many times.
- 2. Choose a number from another triangle and open up for that part of the story.
- 3. See if you can remember which part of the story is under which number!

REFLECT TOGETHER

PRAY TOGETHER



A Rocky Prayer

Fill a pot with a few stones or pebbles.

Using card, pens and paper straws or lolly sticks make some flowers. If you or someone you know is having a 'rocky' or difficult time you can place the 'flower' in the pot and pray. (You might like to write a name on the flower) Leave the pot somewhere you can see it and remember to pray each day –

Lord Jesus,

Please help us to grow into the people you want us to be, especially when we feel as if we're in rocky ground.

Help us when we are finding it difficult to keep following you and listening to what you teach us.

Amen.

Jesus be with us, Jesus be in us, Jesus be around us; Jesus be behind us. Sow in our hearts the good seed of love and joy and peace, that we may be a blessing to the people around us. **Amen.**

DO IT TOGETHER

Grow some roots!
