READ TOGETHER

1 Peter 1: 22 - 2: 3



International Children's Bible (ICB)

²² Now you have made yourselves pure by obeying the truth. Now you can have true love for your brothers. So love each other deeply with all your heart. ²³ You have been born again. This new life did not come from something that dies, but from something that cannot die. You were born again through God's living message that continues forever. ²⁴ The Scripture says,

"All people are like the grass.

And all their strength is like the flowers of the field.

The grass dies and the flowers fall.

²⁵ But the word of the Lord will live forever." (Isaiah 40:6-8)

And this is the word that was preached to you.

2 So then, get rid of all evil and all lying. Do not be a hypocrite. Do not be jealous or speak evil of others. Put all these things out of your life. ² As newborn babies want milk, you should want the pure and simple teaching. TALK TOGETHER

Our Bible passage says that new-born babies long for milk to feed them and help them to grow. If we've started a new life as Christians, we should long for what will help us grow as friends of Jesus.

- What do you think those things are?
- Are there things we should stop doing to help us grow?



Feed the Need to Grow Together

- Spiritual Growth Requires Responding to God's Word (1 Peter 1:22-25)
- Spiritual Growth Requires Embracing Personal Change (1 Peter 2:1-3)



PLAY TOGETHER

Put a line down the middle of your room or garden using string or put two markers one at each end to show where an imaginary line runs. One end of the line means "Yes, I really think that!" The other end of the line means "No, I really don't think that!" (You might want to make a sign to put at each end — one saying "Yes!" and the other saying "No!") The middle of the line means "I'm not sure."

YES!

NO!

Read out the following sentences one at a time and run to stand on the line in a place that best shows what you think. You might want to stand part way down the line to show that you think that but not strongly.

- I can recognise other friends of Jesus by the things that they do
- Being a friend of Jesus means I have to change
- It is difficult being a friend of Jesus
- I am changing as I find out more about what it means to be a friend of Jesus
- Other people have noticed I am changing

After each sentence, chat about why you have stood at that particular point on the line. Then get everyone to move away from the line, read the next sentence and run to the line again.

MAKE TOGETHER - Colour change flower experiment



As we learn and grow in our faith, we change...

You will need:

White flowers

Jars

Water and food colouring

- Put water in each jar and add food colouring if you have different colours then you can choose a different one for each jar.
- Cut all the flower stems to the same length and place one in each jar.
- Wait and see the flowers slowly change colour over the next few days.
 *They take on the colour of the liquid that they are in.

REFLECT TOGETHER

Tom said that one of the ways we grow up as a Christian is by learning to love each other (see 1 Peter 1:22). He asked us three questions:

- ➤ As a Christian have you stopped growing in terms of loving others have things ground to a halt?
- Do you take your Christian faith for granted or are you depending on God?
- In the way that a baby needs milk to grow what does it mean to you to regularly take on what you need to grow as a Christian?





Draw a large heart in the middle of a piece of paper. Inside the heart draw or write things you want to do to become more loving to others. Outside of the heart draw or write things you want to stop doing so that you become more loving to others.

PRAY TOGETHER – Growing as a Christian stepping stones

On separate pieces of paper, draw a picture of a baby, a child, a teenager, a young adult, a middle-aged adult and an older adult. On another piece of paper write 'Not born yet'. Put them on the floor in order from 'Not born yet' to 'older adult'.

Think about where you think you are in your life as a Christian. Remember, we're not thinking about

how long you've been alive and how many birthdays you've had. We're thinking about how long you've been a Christian and how well you think you're growing as a Christian. You might be in your 30s but only be a child or teenager in your Christian life. Or you might still be at school but God



has helped you grow as a Christian and you feel like a young adult.



Stand on the picture that shows how far you think you've grown as a Christian. If you don't think you're a Christian yet, stand on the 'Not born yet'.



Think back to what you said in the Talk Together and Reflect Together sections. What could you do to move on from where you are to the next picture? Do you need to stop doing something? Do you need to start doing something? What will help you grow as a Christian?

As you step from your picture to the next one, ask God to help you to grow.

DO IT TOGETHER

What are the things you've decided you need to do or stop doing to help you grow as a Christian and become more loving to others? Tell someone else in your family or a friend and ask them to check up on how you're doing in a couple of days.

Is there something practical you can do as a family or on your own to show love to someone in our church family this week?
