# **Jesus Teaches About Giving**

**6** "Be careful! When you do good things, don't do them in front of people to be seen by them. If you do that, you will have no reward from your Father in heaven.

<sup>2</sup> "When you give to the poor, don't be like the hypocrites. They blow trumpets in the synagogues and on the streets so that people will see them and honour them. I tell you the truth, those hypocrites already have their full reward. <sup>3</sup> So when you give to the poor, don't let anyone know what you are doing. <sup>4</sup> Your giving should be done in secret. Your Father can see what is done in secret, and he will reward you.

## Giving to the Needy

**6** "Be careful not to practice your righteousness in front of others to be seen by them. If you do, you will have no reward from your Father in heaven.

<sup>2</sup> "So when you give to the needy, do not announce it with trumpets, as the hypocrites do in the synagogues and on the streets, to be honoured by others. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward in full. <sup>3</sup> But when you give to the needy, do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing, <sup>4</sup> so that your giving may be in secret. Then your Father, who sees what is done in secret, will reward you.

# Read the Bible Passage in

The Message (MSG)

Matthew 6: 1-4 ~ The world is not a stage

**6** "Be especially careful when you are trying to be good so that you don't make a performance out of it. It might be good theatre, but the God who made you won't be applauding.

- <sup>2-4</sup> "When you do something for someone else, don't call attention to yourself. You've seen them in action, I'm sure— 'playactors' I call them—treating prayer meeting and street corner alike as a stage, acting compassionate as long as someone is watching, playing to the crowds. They get applause, true, but that's all they get. When you help someone out, don't think about how it looks. Just do it—quietly and unobtrusively. That is the way your God, who conceived you in love, working behind the scenes, helps you out.
  - Have you ever experienced giving by a 'playactor'?
  - Think hard about the times you have given gifts or help. Did you do it quietly or so that others could see? Did you do it so that you might get something in return...so that you might benefit too?

# Terry said that following the example of St Nicholas we should:

**1 - Love Jesus and live the way that Jesus wants us to live** – even when it's hard. What does living like Jesus mean in terms of giving?

Read: 1 John 3: 11 & 16-18

## 2 – Use what you have.

St Nicholas used what he had and gave that. You may not have lots of money to give away. What do you have that you can use to give to others?

Read: Mark 12: 38-44

What does this passage say to you about what we give and how we should give it?

Read: 2 Corinthians 8: 7

## 3 - Don't make it about you.


It isn't about the giver, it's the joy of giving.

# Secret Giving Shoes



We are told that St Nicholas placed secret gifts in shoes (and socks)! Collect a pair of shoes from everyone in your house or some different types of shoes if you are at home by yourself.

Put them in a circle.

As you look at each pair think about where those shoes might take you this week and who you might meet.

How can we show the love of Jesus and be secretly generous in those situations?

## A Prayer Stocking

Choose a Christmas Stocking (if you have one), or a sock, or you could make a paper stocking by sticking two stocking shapes together to make a pocket to put your prayers into. (see the pictures below)

Write down the names of family and friends on separate strips of paper as well as things like 'people who have no food', 'people who have lost their job', 'people who are poorly', etc. Fold these up and put them into the prayer stocking. Each day pull one out and pray for the person/people written on the paper and see if you can think of something you could do to make them smile or to help them out (perhaps use some of the ideas in the **Do Together** section).





#### **DO TOGETHER**

## Make someone smile with a homemade gift.

Bake some cakes or biscuits, or make a special card or gift to cheer someone up. Give anonymously (without them knowing who they came from). Include a note which says "From a friend". Send it in the post or leave it on their doorstep without ringing the bell.



Here is a great biscuit recipe that even young children can get involved with:

(Makes 16 biscuits)

100g (4oz) softened butter 50g (2oz) caster sugar 150g (5oz) self-raising flour

- Preheat the oven to 180°C/160°C fan/Gas 4.
- Lightly butter two baking trays.
- Measure the butter into a bowl and beat to soften. Gradually beat in the sugar and then the flour. Bring the mixture together with your hands to form a dough.
- Form the dough into 16 balls about the size of a walnut and place spaced well apart on the prepared baking trays.
- Dip a fork in a little water and use this to flatten the biscuits.
- Bake in the preheated over for 15-20 minutes until a very pale golden colour.
- Lift off the baking tray and leave to cool completely on a wire rack before packaging up your gift!
