Acts 2: 1-14



International Children's Bible (ICB)

2 When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. ² Suddenly a noise came from heaven. It sounded like a strong wind blowing. This noise filled the whole house where they were sitting. ³ They saw something that looked like flames of fire. The flames were separated and stood over each person there. ⁴ They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and they began to speak different languages. The Holy Spirit was giving them the power to speak these languages.

⁵ There were some religious Jews staying in Jerusalem who were from every country in the world. ⁶ When they heard this noise, a crowd came together. They were all surprised, because each one heard them speaking in his own language. ⁷ They were completely amazed at this. They said, "Look! Aren't all these men that we hear speaking from Galilee? ⁸ But each of us hears them in his own language. How is this possible? 2 When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. ² Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting. ³ They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. ⁴ All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them.

⁵ Now there were staying in Jerusalem God-fearing Jews from every nation under heaven. ⁶ When they heard this sound, a crowd came together in bewilderment, because each one heard their own language being spoken. ⁷ Utterly amazed, they asked: "Aren't all these who are speaking Galileans? ⁸ Then how is it that each of us hears them in our native language? ⁹ Parthians, Medes and Elamites; residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, ¹⁰ Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya near Cyrene; visitors from Rome ¹¹ (both Jews and converts to Judaism); Cretans and Arabs—we hear them declaring the wonders of God in our own tongues!" ¹² Amazed and perplexed, they asked one another, "What does this mean?"

TALK TOGETHER



If someone asked you to explain what Jesus means to you today, what would you say?

(When you've answered that question, now think back over what you said. Did you use words which people who aren't Christians would understand? If not, how could you rephrase what you said?)

STUDY TOGETHER

- Filled with the Holy Spirit, the disciples were able to tell people about Jesus in languages they understood. Do you think we speak the same "language" as our friends, family members or work colleagues who don't yet know Jesus? What could we do to "learn" their language?
- ➤ Terry talked about the need for us to use both actions and words. *Read* Matthew 5:16 and 1 Peter 3:15. How do our actions and words go together?
- There are many different translations and versions of the Bible. There are audio Bibles, Study Bibles and Bible Apps. There are also many different Bible story books. Have a look at the passage in Acts in as many different Bibles as you can. You can find lots on https://www.biblegateway.com/

Here is Acts 2: 1-12 from the Street Bible....

Seven weeks on from the Flyby Festival comes the Jewish Thanksgiving Holiday. The whole squad's hanging out together. From nowhere, this noise like a wild wind blasts around the room. Freaked, they look at each other: flames are flashing round the room like someone's got them linked into a remote control and they're spreading out, zapping everyone systematically. No one gets even first-degree burns, just filled up with God's Holy Spirit. The supernatural overflow is incredible – they're suddenly fluent in languages they've never heard of, as handed out by the Holy Spirit.

Being Thanksgiving, Jerusalem's packed full of religious Jews from all over the known world. They follow the noise and a huge crowd forms, all wide-eyed and open mouthed, everyone tuning in on some squad member talking their language. Totally gobsmacked, they ask, 'They're from Galilee, yeah? The accent gives them away. So how come we all hear them talking in our own language?'

*At least fifteen countries are represented. Pete tells them, 'No, we've not had a skinful: this is what the courier Joel talked about – God marinating people in his Holy Spirit.'

They know the bit, they're gripped, so Pete explains about Jesus being the Liberator...

Which version are you drawn to? Which do you find easier to understand?

PLAY TOGETHER

Communication Games



Words aren't the only way to communicate!
You may have played games like *Pictionary, Charades or Rapidough*where instead of describing something with words you draw pictures, act
out or even make models from playdough.

Take it in turns to choose a word from today's Bible story. Choose a way to communicate – can you draw it, act it or model it? Can the rest of the people in your house guess which word it is?

MAKE TOGETHER

Have you ever thought about re-telling and talking about a Bible story through baking?! Have a go at making some *Gingerbread Pentecost People!*

DO TOGETHER

Think about ways in which you might share your faith this week.
