GATHER TOGETHER

A prayer to start –

Holy God, our only hope is in You. We thank you for the past, trust you for today and believe for the future; that all Your promises will come to pass so we can rest forever in Your love. **Amen**

Action reminder –

From the top of my head (Touch head) to the tips of my toes; (Touch toes) from the lobes of my ears (Touch ear lobes) to the end of my nose; (Touch nose) from my back, to my front (Turn round) to my wiggly fingers, (stretch out arms and wiggle fingers) God loves me! (jump up and down)

³ Make the weak hands strong. Make the weak knees strong.

TALK TOGETHER

As we begin this New Year...

- Think back What were your hopes at the beginning of 2020?
- What are your hopes right now?
- Look forward What are your hopes for the future?

STUDY TOGETHER

Isaiah 35: 4

Be Strong. Don't be afraid. Your God will come.

Angeline explained the situation that God's people were in at the time Isaiah spoke these words to them. A different situation to the one we find ourselves in now but these words are still relevant to us today.

- Do these words bring you hope? Why?
- The Bible is full of God's promises to his people. Angeline reminded us of some:
 - ✤ I will never leave you
 - Don't worry but pray and God's peace will keep your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus
 - Nothing can separate us from the love of God
 - God works all things together for good for those who love him
- Can you find any more?

Verses 5-7 paint a beautiful picture of healing and hope.

• Although these verses obviously speak about physical healing, we can receive spiritual healing too. How might the blind see and the deaf hear in a spiritual sense?

Verses 6-7 talk about life springing up in the desert.

• You might like to use the **Reflect Together** section to think some more about this.

Angeline told us that although this passage is a message of hope for us now as it was for God's people back then, it has a bigger meaning. Read again the passage from **Revelation 21: 3-4**

³ I heard a loud voice from the throne. The voice said, "Now God's home is with men. He will live with them, and they will be his people. God himself will be with them and will be their God. ⁴ He will wipe away every tear from their eyes. There will be no more death, sadness, crying, or pain. All the old ways are gone."

We have a hope that reaches far into the future - an eternal hope -

Be Strong. Don't be afraid. Your God will come.

PLAY TOGETHER

With young children you might like to 'Play the story' You will need: Something to be the desert: maybe a tray of rice or couscous (if you don't mind messy/sensory play) or a yellow duster Something blue for the streams: maybe a scarf Some greenery or flowers: maybe some leaves you have found on a walk

Bring your 'desert' to life with the things you have collected as you say the words and do the actions together.

God gave a message to Isaiah (spiral one hand towards yourself) and Isaiah told the people: (spiral the same hand away from your mouth) streams of water will flow through the desert, ('ripple' your fingers) and flowers will bloom in the wilderness. ('grow' your hands like flowers opening)

Finding Hope

Write the word 'HOPE' on several pieces of card and hide them round your home or garden. Everyone else has to try and find them. When all the cards have been found talk about the fact that sometimes, when life is difficult, hope is hard to find - but with God it's always there somewhere if we look for it.

MAKE TOGETHER

Blooming Flowers

During our service, we used folded flowers to write our prayers on. You could do the same at home!

You could also make *Flowers of Hope* to send to your friends and family! Here's how:

- Take a piece of paper and draw two circles a large one with a smaller one inside.
- Now draw petal shapes as shown in the picture. They don't have to be exactly the same size or shape.
- Colour in your flower. (Tip: don't use water soluble pens like felt tips. Pencils or crayons work best!)
- Cut out your flower.
- Write your message of hope in the middle.
- Fold all the petals in turn, into the middle and send it to a friend, neighbour or someone in your family with the instruction to drop it onto a tray or plate of water.
