
## **New International Version (NIV)**



#### **TALK TOGETHER**

- ➤ Do you think it's important to read the Bible? Why/why not? (You might like to look at 2 Tim.3:15-17)
- When was the last time you read it? (If you're discussing this in your life group, you might just like to think about this question rather than answer it out loud)
- Do you use anything to help you understand what you read?



#### STUDY TOGETHER



Angeline said that the first line of the Bible – 'In the beginning God created' – is like a musical motif that runs through the Bible. Let's look at some of the places where it can be seen and think about why it's an important theme.

Read Exodus 32:1-4 & Isaiah 44:13-17, 24

- What is the difference between God the Creator and the 'gods' people make for themselves?
- Are we ever in danger of replacing Creator God with 'false gods'?

In the book of Job we read about a man who had everything taken away from him (his family, his wealth, his health). Some friends came to talk to him and made him feel even worse by their belief that he must have done something wrong to deserve what has happened to him. Job protested his innocence and longed for God to answer. For most of the book God stays silent but finally speaks in ch.38.

Read Job 38:1-11

- Why do you think God details all these things he has created?

Read Psalm 148:1-12

- Do you agree that creation can praise God? If yes, how does it do that?

On one of Paul's mission trips, he spends time in Athens where he sees statues of gods everywhere. Read Acts 17:22-31

- What does Paul use as a way in to tell the Athenians about God?
- How does he describe God?

As the Revelation passage is read, use your imaginations to picture the vision John describes. *Read Genesis* 1:1; Revelation 21:1-5

- The book of Revelation is full of symbols and images, and this passage is no exception, but even here we can hear the familiar motif. How do the beginning and end of the Bible compare?

As you think about the opening words of the Bible, "In the beginning God created" – what does it mean to you and to your faith?

#### **PLAY TOGETHER**

#### 'Sword' Drill

Why is it called Sword Drill?

"God's word is alive and working. It is sharper than a sword sharpened on both sides. It cuts all the way into us... And God's word judges the thoughts and feelings in our hearts."

#### Hebrews 4:12

One of the ways the Bible describes itself is like a sword. Sometimes when we read the Bible, it's a bit like something sharp and pointy poking us, making us feel a bit uncomfortable as we realise there are things in our lives we ought to change to become more like Jesus.



So, we're going to imagine our Bibles are swords. We're not going to poke people with them (that would be bad!). Instead, everyone needs a Bible. Hold it under your arm and when someone calls out "Draw swords", hold your Bible with one hand, high in the air. Take it in turns to call out a Bible verse and shout "Charge!" Everyone must then look it up as fast they can. Whoever finds it first should read the first few words. Let everyone else find it if they want to, then the person who found it first can read the whole verse out for everyone to hear.

You could use these verses, which are all about the Bible and reading God's word:

- Psalm 119:89
- Isaiah 40:8
- Matthew 13:20
- Matthew 24:35
- John 5:24
- Acts 13:49
- 2 Timothy 3:15 (Scriptures means the 'holy writings' or the Bible)

## Go Find it! - Explore God's Creation

Some of you may be lucky enough to have a set of 'Go Find It' cards but if not, you can still play this game! The cards have just one word on them and the game is to either be the one who finds the most of the 'thing' on the card or see who can be the first to find the' thing'.



The cards have words on them like:

- Red / Yellow / Green so you would be looking for something that is that colour.
- Wow! / 0000! so you would be looking for something that makes you go 'Wow!' or '0000!'
- Snap / Crunch / Big / Small / Tiny / Wet / Dry you get the idea!

The only rules are that you don't pick wildflowers, you only pick things from the ground and not off growing plants or trees and you *mustn't* pick up live creatures!

You don't need a set of cards to play – you could make your own. Just write words on pieces of paper and put them in a small bag to take outside with you on a walk and have fun exploring **God's Amazing Creation!** 

#### **MAKE TOGETHER**

#### **Bible Bookmarks**

Here are some ideas for making your own Bible Bookmark:

#### **Block Letter Bookmark**


You will need:


A piece of card measuring about 20cms x 5cms A black marker or felt tip Pens and/or pencils



Mark out a grid as shown in the picture: draw a black outline around the outside of the bookmark and then mark 4 lines across. In our example we marked them at 4.5cm, 6.5cm, 11cm and 15.5cm. Your measurements will depend on the size of your card but the second 'box should be narrower than the rest.

Then mark inside the boxes as shown:





The marks will make the word BIBLE; Then you can colour it in!



## **Beginning and End Bookmark**



If you are going to accept the challenge of reading through the whole Bible (see the **Do Together** Section) you could make a bookmark that illustrates the passage we have looked at today (Genesis 1:1) and then leave the back blank. When you've completed

the challenge you can then illustrate the back of the bookmark with the verse from Revelation 22:20 – The beginning and end of the Bible.



### Favourite Verse Bookmark

You could choose to illustrate your favourite Bible verse on your bookmark. There are lots of ways you can do this. Using colourful letters, drawing, painting, collage, stickers; it really is up to you. It's your favourite verse for a reason, it means something to you, so make it personal.

#### REFLECT TOGETHER

As you read your Bible each day you might like to spend some time reflecting on what you have read:



- What does this tell me about God?
- What is God saying to me through this passage?
- What do I want to say to God?

One way to reflect on these questions is to use a journal. You can do this in any notepad or on loose sheets of paper that you keep together in a folder or clipped together in some way.

You can write down the answers to these questions or make notes of words that stand out or you can draw pictures.

It's a really helpful way to think more deeply about what you read and how it applies to your life, right now. It can also be helpful to look back at and see how your relationship with God changes; what God says to you when you read a passage now might be different when you read it again in the future.

## A Prayer before you read your Bible:


Open my mind, Lord, as I read today so that I learn more of you;
