
Action reminder –

From the top of my head (Touch head) to the tips of my toes; (Touch toes) from the lobes of my ears (Touch ear lobes) to the end of my nose; (Touch nose) from my back, to my front (Turn round) to my wiggly fingers, (stretch out arms and wiggle fingers) God loves me! (jump up and down) Acts 6: 1-7



International Children's Bible (ICB)

6 More and more people were becoming followers of Jesus. But during this same time, the Greek-speaking followers had an argument with the other Jewish followers. The Greekspeaking Jews said that their widows were not getting their share of the food that was given out every day. ² The 12 apostles called the whole group of followers together. They said, "It is not right for us to stop our work of teaching God's word in order to serve tables. ³ So, brothers, choose seven of your own men. They must be men who are good. They must be full of wisdom and full of the Spirit. We will put them in charge of this work. ⁴ Then we can use all our time to pray and to teach the word of God."




⁵ The whole group liked the idea. So they chose these seven men: Stephen (a man with great faith and full of the Holy Spirit), Philip, Procorus, Nicanor, Timon, Parmenas, and Nicolas (a man from Antioch who had become a Jew). ⁶ Then they put these men before the apostles. The apostles prayed and laid their hands on the men.

⁷ The word of God was reaching more and more people. The group of followers in Jerusalem became larger and larger. A great number of the Jewish priests believed and obeyed.

New International Version (NIV)

6 In those days when the number of disciples was increasing, the Hellenistic Jews among them complained against the Hebraic Jews because their widows were being overlooked in the daily distribution of food. ² So the Twelve gathered all the disciples together and said, "It would not be right for us to neglect the ministry of the word of God in order to wait on tables. ³ Brothers and sisters, choose seven men from among you who are known to be full of the Spirit and wisdom. We will turn this responsibility over to them ⁴ and will give our attention to prayer and the ministry of the word."



⁵ This proposal pleased the whole group. They chose Stephen, a man full of faith and of the Holy Spirit; also Philip, Procorus, Nicanor, Timon, Parmenas, and Nicolas from Antioch, a convert to Judaism. ⁶ They presented these men to the apostles, who prayed and laid their hands on them.

⁷ So the word of God spread. The number of disciples in Jerusalem increased rapidly, and a large number of priests became obedient to the faith.

> Has there ever been a time when you have wondered what God was doing in your life?

STUDY TOGETHER

We're going to consider a few passages in Acts in this week's study.

Read Acts 4:4

How many believers were there in Jerusalem?

Read Acts 5:12-29

- \blacktriangleright What happened as a result of the apostles' miracles and preaching (v.14)?
- What was the response of the high priest and his associates (v.17-18)?
- If hundreds of people became Christians in Weston and suddenly the church leaders were taken away, what would we think? What would we say to God?
- Did the apostles stay in jail?
- When the high priest told them to stop telling people about Jesus, what was the apostles' response (v.29)

Read Acts 5:40-42

- What happened to the apostles?
- What was the apostles' response?
- If this was you, would you wonder what God was doing?

Now read Acts 6:1-7

- In the middle of all this, the apostles also had to manage church life and business. What was the issue that arose? How did they deal with it?
- > Why was it important to hand over the choice of the men to God and to the people?
- Have you ever felt that there are too many difficult things going on for you to handle? How did you deal with it?
- > When times like this come up in our lives, how can we trust God and find his guidance?

We learned that the Apostles had one difficult thing to deal with after another, but they kept trusting God.

MAKE TOGETHER

Eggshell Mosaic

Sometimes we feel broken by all the difficult stuff. Sometimes it can feel like cracks are appearing in our lives. No matter what we are going through or how hard it gets, we can always turn to God for help. Have a go at making an Eggshell Mosaic as a reminder of this truth.



If you are cooking eggs or baking a cake, save the eggshells. Give them a good wash in hot soapy water and leave them to dry on kitchen paper.

If you want to add colour to your shells, you can soak them in a bowl of hot water mixed with food colouring and a splash of vinegar. Once they have taken on the colour, take them out and leave them on kitchen paper to dry.

Next, cut out a simple cross shape using cardboard from your recycling box (cereal boxes are great for this). Cover your cross shape with glue. Crush the eggshells into small pieces and place them onto the cross to make a mosaic. If you have some PVA or runny craft glue, you can carefully paint some over the top of the eggshells to seal them. Leave it to dry.

Once the mosaic is dry you can hang it up or use it as a way into prayer: Run your fingers over the cracked surface as you ask God to help you with the difficult things in your life.

REFLECT TOGETHER

Keith talked about not giving in to fearful "What ifs?" One way to do that is to turn fearful "What ifs?" on their head and instead imagine "What if we let God take first place in our lives?" Here's a meditation by Julian Hamilton to help us do that.

What if ...?

What if the wild, roaring sea, tempestuous and torturous, wild and raging, was nothing to be afraid of? What if the most dreaded illness to roam the face of the earth was something you could smile at and exclaim, 'do your worst', to?

Or what about if the authorities that held you down, silenced your voice, destroyed your reputation and diminished your cause, were nothing except a pitiful power-play of annoying persistence?

What if pain didn't have to be permanent? Despair didn't have to be draining? Sadness didn't have to silence us? And depression didn't have to deaden our spirit?

What if ...? What if death was not the end?

What if the things that make us cry, all the things that get us uptight, all the small battles, all the small fights, all the misunderstandings, could all turn out right?

What if all we see, is not all there is? But in every second, another breath lives? The breath of life, first breathed into man, is now breathed through this earth in divine master-plan? If that was the case, then we would not be surprised, astonished or ashamed, that we have no answers when the wildness is tamed. The kingdom would breed life, God-life in all. It would be upside down, inside out, topsy-turvy, and continually on a roll.

Seas can be quieted. Death can be banished, Suffering endured and oppressive authority ended.

For the 'what if' is God's mighty kingdom. The dream of what can be, the vision of what should be, the hope of what will be.

It's wild, adventurous, untamed and free And in it God places you and me. To live in his moment, is to chase the divine And to continually ask, 'what if God's will becomes mine?'

Go and live, in the pleasure and power, patience and love, of the God of divine mystery and holy dreams. Let it be.

What was God doing?



Take a piece of paper and as you sit quietly, write on one side all the difficult things you have experienced over this last year. Then, ask God to help you see what he was doing in those difficult circumstances and write those down on the other side of the paper.

For example:

COVID 19 – God gave scientists the skill and knowledge to create a vaccine Isolation – God showed me just how much I value my friends and family Church services stopped – God gave some of our church family the skill to bring us online and live streamed worship

PRAY TOGETHER

Praying into the cracks?

When lots of difficulties come along all at once it can feel like we cannot hold everything together and cracks are appearing in our lives. The phrase 'papering over the cracks' means to cover up problems and difficulties and pretend they aren't there. When we do this, often the cracks appear again, sometimes bigger than they were before. Instead of papering over the cracks in our lives, try to pray into them instead.





In the City of Jerusalem, people come to place written prayers into the cracks in the Western Wall.

Perhaps you have a suitable wall in your garden or if not, you could collect some pebbles and build a wall indoors.

Think about the things that you need help and guidance from God with right now and write it on a piece of paper. Fold or roll it up and place it into a crack in the wall. As you do this, ask God to help you and trust that he will.



If you pray this prayer with your family, you might like to encourage younger ones to do the following actions:

- When you say "I praise you", put your thumbs up
- When you say "I talk to you", put your hands together as if you're praying
- When you say "I am safe with you", give yourself a hug

God our Father, when I am happy, I praise you; when I am sad, I talk to you; happy or sad, I know that I am safe with you.

When things are peaceful, I praise you; when things change, I talk to you; peaceful or changing, I know that things are safe with you.

When I hear good news, I praise you; when I hear bad news, I talk to you; good news or bad news, I know the future's safe with you.

Today and tomorrow, I know that I am safe with you. Amen.

DO TOGETHER

Everyone has been suffering in some way this past year and we could all have had times when we have felt like asking, 'What are you doing, God?!'



Like the early church, who shared everything, could you think of someone who is or has been struggling and think of a way you could help. Could you share God's love with them? It could be someone known to you personally or more generally. In which case, helping with or donating to a charity might be what you choose to do.

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
