Coffee after the Service...

He Makes Beautiful Things Out Of Us

Our God is a God of transformation. He takes us just as we are and makes us all that we can be. He's like a master craftsman that finds an old piece of driftwood, takes it home and whittles and shapes it into something beautiful. In His hands we are transformed, from the inside out. God is not just for eternal life, that eternity starts now as He reshapes us, changes us, and smooths edges off us. He enables us to put off the 'Old man' and put on the new. Those who are 'In Christ' are a new creation, the old has gone, the new has come (see 2 Cor 5:17). That newness takes time and effort to develop, both ours and God's. But gradually, we lay down, lose and reject our old ways of being, thinking and doing, and start gaining wisdom and understanding. As we do, we start adopting His ways of being, thinking and behaving, so that we become more like Jesus. Dietrich Bonhoeffer said that 'A Christian's life should cause non-believers to question their disbelief that God exists'. The change that takes place in us should be evident to others. The Bible is full of people who were transformed; Peter from someone who denied Jesus to becoming the rock on which the church was established. Paul was transformed from a persecutor of Christians to passionate Advocate for the Lord. And God wants to transform us too. If we let Him, He will. Let's work with Him and be transformed!

Sermon Snippets

We hear today about the apostle Paul in a very different context from Israel. In Athens there wasn't one God worshipped - nor even several - the place was packed full with idols!

Although we don't have gold and ivory covered marble idols as these Athenians did, I wonder if our society isn't full of more subtle idols which take our attention away from God? Money? Fashion? Beauty? Entertainment? Not that all of these things are bad in themselves... until they take too much of our attention that we start treating them as the guide for how we live our lives.

Paul was distressed at what he saw. Are we concerned for others caught up in our society and distanced from God? Who do we pray for?

And also... how about you and me? Is our faith a bit like an RE lesson in our school timetable where we spend a few minutes doing "the God element" and then move on to another lesson forgetting much of what we've learnt? Or is our faith in a God who is over all of our life? Is He the same sort of God that Paul preached to the Athenians?
