When they saw the courage of Peter and John and realized that they were unschooled, ordinary men, they were astonished and they took note that these men had been with Jesus.



## Action reminder -


From the top of my head

### 1 Thessalonians 1: 1-10



## **International Children's Bible (ICB)**



1 From Paul, Silas, and Timothy.

To the church in Thessalonica, the church in God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. May God's grace and peace be yours.

<sup>2</sup> We always remember you when we pray and thank God for all of you. <sup>3</sup> When we pray to God our Father, we always thank him for the things you have done because of your faith. And we thank him for the work you have done because of your love. And we thank him that you continue to be strong because of your hope in our Lord Jesus Christ.

<sup>4</sup> Brothers, God loves you. And we know that he has chosen you to be his. <sup>5</sup> We brought the Good News to you. But we did not use only words. We brought the Good News with power, with the Holy Spirit, and with sure knowledge that it is true. Also you know how we lived when we were with you. We lived that way to help you. <sup>6</sup> And you became like us and like the Lord. You suffered much, but still you accepted the teaching with the joy that comes from the Holy Spirit. <sup>7</sup> So you became an example to all the believers in Macedonia and Southern Greece. <sup>8</sup> The Lord's teaching spread from you in Macedonia and Southern Greece. And your faith in God has become known everywhere. So we do not need to say anything about your faith. <sup>9</sup> People everywhere are telling about the good way you accepted us when we were there with you. They tell about how you stopped worshiping idols and changed to serving the living and true God. <sup>10</sup> And you changed to wait for God's Son to come from heaven. God raised that Son from death. He is Jesus, who saves us from God's angry judgment that is sure to come.

## **New International Version (NIV)**

1 Paul, Silas and Timothy,

To the church of the Thessalonians in God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ:

Grace and peace to you.

<sup>2</sup> We always thank God for all of you and continually mention you in our prayers. <sup>3</sup> We remember before our God and Father your work produced by faith, your labour prompted by love, and your endurance inspired by hope in our Lord Jesus Christ.

<sup>4</sup> For we know, brothers and sisters loved by God, that he has chosen you, <sup>5</sup> because our gospel came to you not simply with words but also with power, with the Holy Spirit and deep conviction. You know how we lived among you for your sake. <sup>6</sup> You became imitators of us and of the Lord, for you welcomed the message in the midst of severe suffering with the joy given by the Holy Spirit. <sup>7</sup> And so you became a model to all the believers in Macedonia and Achaia. <sup>8</sup> The Lord's message rang out from you not only in Macedonia and Achaia—your faith in God has become known everywhere. Therefore we do not need to say anything about it, <sup>9</sup> for they themselves report what kind of reception you gave us. They tell how you turned to God from idols to serve the living and true God, <sup>10</sup> and to wait for his Son from heaven, whom he raised from the dead—Jesus, who rescues us from the coming wrath.

#### **WATCH TOGETHER**

1 Thessalonians is a letter written by Paul, the same man who we met when we studied Acts 9 together a couple of weeks ago. Paul travelled far and wide, telling people about Jesus and he wrote letters to help the people who became followers.

#### **TALK TOGETHER**

- What does it mean to have faith?
- How can what you do and how you act show your faith?

#### STUDY TOGETHER

The church in Thessalonica was still very young and facing great difficulties when Paul wrote this letter. He and his companions had been forced to leave as their lives were in danger. **Read Acts 17: 1-10** 

Paul writes this letter to the new believers to encourage them in their faith and assure them of Christ's return. **Read 1 Thessalonians 1:1-10** 

After the opening greeting, Paul begins his letter by assuring them of their prayers and thanks. (v2)

• What are the three qualities that he recognises in the Thessalonians? (v3)

Paul notes that they are marks of an authentic Christian life and refers to them in other letters (notably 1 Corinthians 13:13)

• Can you recognise the impact of faith in Jesus in your 'work'? How?

(v4-10) Paul reminds them of their encounter with the Holy Spirit and the strength of their conviction when they first heard the gospel.

- How did their new found faith affect the behaviour of the Thessalonians. (v6, 9)
- What effect did this change have on those around them? (v7-8)
- The Thessalonians experienced suffering In times of difficulty and suffering how does the hope inspired by your faith help you?



The opening passage of this letter shows a community of believers with an 'authentic faith'.

- What does it mean for our faith to be authentic?
- What does it look like to be living our lives for God, authentically?

#### **PLAY TOGETHER**

## Follow the Leader Obstacle Course

In our Bible passage we read that because of their faith the Thessalonians tried to behave and act like Jesus. Even when they went through very difficult times their faith showed in all they did. This caused others to become followers.



Create an obstacle course (inside or outside). Choose one person to be the leader. The leader chooses different actions to do as they move through the course (such as hopping, jumping or crawling) and everyone else has to follow and copy what they do – no matter how difficult it gets!
