(jump up and down)




READ TOGETHER

Nehemiah 3: 1-12



International Children's Bible (ICB)



3 Eliashib the high priest and his fellow priests went to work. They rebuilt the Sheep Gate. They gave it to the Lord's service and set its doors in place. They worked as far as the Tower of the Hundred, and they gave it to the Lord's service. Then they went on to the Tower of Hananel. ² The men of Jericho built the part of the wall next to the priests. And Zaccur son of Imri built next to them.

³ The sons of Hassenaah rebuilt the Fish Gate. They set the boards in place. And they put its doors, bolts and bars in place. ⁴ Meremoth son of Uriah made repairs next to them. (Uriah was the son of Hakkoz.) Meshullam son of Berekiah worked next to Meremoth. (Berekiah was the son of Meshezabel.) And Zadok son of Baana worked next to Meshullam. ⁵ The men from Tekoa made repairs next to them. But the leading men of Tekoa would not work under their supervisors.

⁶ Joiada son of Paseah and Meshullam son of Besodeiah repaired the Old Gate. They set its boards in place. And they put its doors, bolts and bars in place. ⁷ Next to them, men from Gibeon and Mizpah made repairs. Melatiah was from Gibeon, and Jadon was from Meronoth. These places were ruled by the governor west of the Euphrates River. ⁸ Next to them, Uzziel son of Harhaiah made repairs. He was a goldsmith. And next to him, Hananiah made repairs. He was one of the people who made perfume. These men rebuilt Jerusalem as far as the Broad Wall. ⁹ The next part of the wall was repaired by Rephaiah son of Hur. He was ruler of half of the district of Jerusalem. ¹⁰ Next to him, Jedaiah son of Harumaph made repairs. He worked opposite his own house. And next to him, Hattush son of Hashabneiah made repairs. ¹¹ Malkijah son of Harim and Hasshub son of Pahath-Moab repaired another part of the wall. And they repaired the Tower of the Ovens. ¹² Next to them, Shallum son of Hallohesh made repairs. He was ruler of half of the district of Jerusalem. His daughters helped him.


New International Version (NIV)

3 Eliashib the high priest and his fellow priests went to work and rebuilt the Sheep Gate. They dedicated it and set its doors in place, building as far as the Tower of the Hundred, which they dedicated, and as far as the Tower of Hananel. ² The men of Jericho built the adjoining section, and Zakkur son of Imri built next to them.

³ The Fish Gate was rebuilt by the sons of Hassenaah. They laid its beams and put its doors and bolts and bars in place. ⁴ Meremoth son of Uriah, the son of Hakkoz, repaired the next section. Next to him Meshullam son of Berekiah, the son of Meshezabel, made repairs, and next to him Zadok son of Baana also made repairs. ⁵ The next section was repaired by the men of Tekoa, but their nobles would not put their shoulders to the work under their supervisors.

⁶ The Jeshanah Gate was repaired by Joiada son of Paseah and Meshullam son of Besodeiah. They laid its beams and put its doors with their bolts and bars in place. ⁷ Next to them, repairs were made by men from Gibeon and Mizpah—Melatiah of Gibeon and Jadon of Meronoth—places under the authority of the governor of Trans-Euphrates. ⁸ Uzziel son of Harhaiah, one of the goldsmiths, repaired the next

section; and Hananiah, one of the perfume-makers, made repairs next to that. They restored Jerusalem as far as the Broad Wall. ⁹ Rephaiah son of Hur, ruler of a half-district of Jerusalem, repaired the next section. ¹⁰ Adjoining this, Jedaiah son of Harumaph made repairs opposite his house, and Hattush son of Hashabneiah made repairs next to him. ¹¹ Malkijah son of Harim and Hasshub son of Pahath-Moab repaired another section and the Tower of the Ovens. ¹² Shallum son of Hallohesh, ruler of a half-district of Jerusalem, repaired the next section with the help of his daughters.



What does teamwork look like? Are you part of a team? What part do you play?

STUDY TOGETHER Read the whole of Nehemiah 3.



Nehemiah takes us on a tour around Jerusalem, beginning with the Sheep Gate. He describes for us each section, gate and tower on the wall and who worked to rebuild it.

- Before he began work, Nehemiah prayed, made a plan and then organised his workforce. Why do you think he did things in that order?
- Nehemiah was a practical person. God blessed him with good organisational skills. Do we sometimes try to organise God? How can we avoid that?
- Do we see a difference in the prayer and the practical approaches to a problem? How can they work together?
- What sort of people worked on the wall? What skills did they have?
- In what ways do you think being part of the team that rebuilt the walls also rebuilt the community?
- What does this chapter say to you about how we work together in church?

PLAY TOGETHER

Working together to build the walls



The whole of **Nehemiah 3** is an account of the teamwork required to rebuild the walls of Jerusalem.

This is something you can do as a family, with friends or in a group. Sit in a circle and give each person a pile of building bricks (lego/duplo or wooden blocks) – you could use Jenga type blocks or even cardboard boxes from the recycling. Each person builds their own section of wall. You might like to allocate gates to build (Sheep, Fish, Horse, Fountain etc.) and customise your walls!

When all the walls are built, work together to join them up to form one wall.

How did it go? Was it easy to work as a team?

In the *Watch Together* section, we saw some young people on a Christian Camp trying out some team building activities. Here's one you might like to try:

Hula Hoop Pass



Stand in a circle. One person places a hula hoop on their arm and the group then close the circle by holding hands. The aim is to move the hula hoop around the circle (passing it over each person) without letting go of any hands! * If you don't have a hula hoop you can do this with a long scarf or piece of string tied into a loop – just make sure it's big enough to go over everyone in the group.

Part of God's Team!

Nehemiah didn't rebuild the walls on his own. God gave him the skills to plan, organise and gather teams of people to work together on it. We are all part of God's team – you may be part of a family, a class, a club, a Life Group or a team at work or in church.

DO TOGETHER


Teamwork!
