Ezra 1: 1:5



International Children's Bible (ICB)



1 It was the first year Cyrus was king of Persia. The Lord caused Cyrus to write an announcement and send it everywhere in his kingdom. And he also put it in writing. This happened so the Lord's message spoken by Jeremiah would come true. The announcement said:

²This is what Cyrus king of Persia says:

The Lord, the God of heaven, has given all the kingdoms of the earth to me. And he has appointed me to build a Temple for him at Jerusalem in Judah. ³ Now all of you who are God's people are free to go to Jerusalem. May your God be with you. And you may build the Temple of the Lord. He is the God of Israel, who is in Jerusalem. ⁴ Those who stay behind should support anyone who wants to go. Give them silver and gold, supplies and cattle. And give them special gifts for the Temple of God in Jerusalem.

⁵ Then the family leaders of Judah and Benjamin got ready to go to Jerusalem. So did the priests and the Levites. They were going to Jerusalem to build the Temple of the Lord. God made all these people want to go.

New International Version (NIV)

1 In the first year of Cyrus king of Persia, in order to fulfil the word of the LORD spoken by Jeremiah, the LORD moved the heart of Cyrus king of Persia to make a proclamation throughout his realm and also to put it in writing:



² "This is what Cyrus king of Persia says:

"'The LORD, the God of heaven, has given me all the kingdoms of the earth and he has appointed me to build a temple for him at Jerusalem in Judah. ³ Any of his people among you may go up to Jerusalem in Judah and build the temple of the LORD, the God of Israel, the God who is in Jerusalem, and may their God be with them. ⁴ And in any locality where survivors may now be living, the people are to provide them with silver and gold, with goods and livestock, and with freewill offerings for the temple of God in Jerusalem."

⁵ Then the family heads of Judah and Benjamin, and the priests and Levites—everyone whose heart God had moved—prepared to go up and build the house of the LORD in Jerusalem.

TALK TOGETHER

Can God work through anyone? Even people who don't know him?

STUDY TOGETHER

Angeline read **Jeremiah 25: 11b – 13 and 29: 10** in her sermon and explained that God had promised the Jews that he would punish Babylon and they would then be able to return home. God's people were in exile for 70 years. In the verse that follows, **(Jeremiah 29: 11)** God tells his people that he is in control and that his plans are for their good.

God can work anywhere and through anyone. Here he chooses to work through Cyrus, King of Persia.

Read Isaiah 44: 28 and 45: 1-6

(This prophecy from Isaiah came almost 150 years before the rule of Cyrus.) Cyrus is referred to as shepherd and anointed -

- What do you think this means?
- What does this passage in Isaiah tell you about God?
- What does it tell you about Cyrus?

Read 2 Chronicles 36: 22 -23 and then Ezra 1: 1-3

• What do you notice?

Angeline explained that Cyrus thought he was acting on the instruction of his god, Marduk. He was in fact fulfilling the promise that God had made to his people years before.


- What do the opening verses of Ezra tell you about God?

- How do these passages help when we think about the difficulties we see in the world around us?
- How do they help when we face personal difficulties?




Two Perspectives?

MAKE TOGETHER

Pocket Promises

Sometimes when life is difficult and we see our world in chaos, we need a reminder that *God keeps his promises*, *he is in control and we can trust him*.



Take a small square of paper and write those words across it. Then, fold it into a heart to remind you of God's love for you and for his world. Keep it in your pocket for whenever you need it.

*The Bible is full of God's promises. Maybe there is one that is particularly special to you? You could write that inside your Pocket Promise heart instead.

Follow the pictures to see how to fold the heart:



1. Fold the square into thirds



2. Fold the bottom right corner towards the left fold



3. Now fold the right side to the same left fold



4. Fold the bottom left corner up to meet the fold in the middle (this is the bottom of your heart.



5. Open it up to fold the top down, inside and then close the side flaps over it.



6. Turn it over



7. Fold down the top and side points slightly to create softer edges for your heart.

8. You can use any paper you have, coloured, wrapping or decorate your own.

God is in Control - prayer drawing

Angeline reminded us that God is at work in global, national and local situations. He can work through rulers and leaders and he is with us and at work in us. He is in control.

Think of a situation or a decision that might be troubling you and begin to draw it, **BUT**, don't allow your pen or pencil to leave the paper. Draw it in one continuous line. It might not look like a work of art and it might even look really messy but remember, what looks chaotic and unsolvable to us is nothing of the sort to our faithful God. As you draw, remember that God's hand is on that situation constantly, his pen never leaves the page, he has a plan, he is in control and you can trust him. Finish your drawing by writing the words 'God is in control'
