Sermon Snippets

John 4: 1-26



During our first Sunday services, we've been looking at different people who met Jesus in John's gospel. In particular we've looked at the barrier each of them had and how that barrier was overcome. Earlier examples of these impediments were prejudice ("does anything good come from Nazareth?" someone wondered on hearing of Jesus) and also status (where Nicodemus overcomes the knowledge that he was a religious expert and asks a question of Jesus, who had no formal training).

Today we hear of a woman who ventured out into the public arena at a time when she hoped no one else would be around. She knew she was unpopular and yet doesn't avoid a conversation with the one man who was also there – Jesus. We'll hear more about what might have stopped her on Sunday, but if you want to find out more – have a read of John 4.

Verse For The Week

"Jesus answered, 'Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again, but whoever drinks the water I give them will never thirst. Indeed, the water I give them will become in them a spring of water welling up to eternal life."

John 4: 13-14

Saturday – Remember before God those who are not well, especially thinking of those we are aware of within our own congregations who are suffering at this present time.

Ukraine Crisis Response Update

- Samaritan's Purse has 163 specialists on the ground.
- We deployed an Emergency Field Hospital to Ukraine that opened for patients on 14th March.
- We have three additional medical facilities in Ukraine.
- Using our DC-8 cargo plane, we deployed our fifth airlift to the region on 23rd March carrying more than 19 tonnes of relief.
- We are distributing water, food, hygiene items, blankets and winter clothing to people in transit.
- We have delivered aid to over 43,000 people through our response so far.

Prayer Labyrinth

A labyrinth is not a maze to get lost in, it is a single wandering pathway. Labyrinths have been used for centuries as a way of encouraging Christian reflection, meditation, and prayer. We are constructing a simple indoor Labyrinth in Christ Church for Holy



Week where the various places to pause will help focus our minds on the 'l am...' sayings of Jesus that we have been hearing about over the past weeks.



Each 'station' will have an explanation and some suggestions for prayers some involving simple acts to help us focus. You go round the labyrinth for self-directed private prayer and the average time it takes should be about 40 minutes but there will be various places where you can quit the labyrinth if you need to. There will be some simple resources for children as well if families would like to give it a go.

We shall launch the Labyrinth on **Sunday 10th April** at 5.00pm where we invite people to gather for an explanation of the journey. Refreshments will be served then until 6.30pm to allow us to let people round in small numbers to prevent congestion.

It will then be open during the next few days from **Monday II**th until **Wednesday I3**th at both 9.30am to 12 noon and 6.00pm until 8.00pm each day.

We could still do with some volunteers to act as stewards at these times so that the Labyrinth remains attended. Contact Terry Baillie if you can help for an hour or two.
